# Program Planning and Counselling

The Student Services Centre is open from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday to Friday and 6:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. Monday to Thursday. Experienced counsellors are available to help students with their college plans.

Students are advised to plan their courses well in advance of registration and to take advantage of all counselling services offered.

Official enquiries about admission, records, and standing should be directed to Dr. J. J. Denholm, Vice-Principal, Student Services.

Students who require guidance will have the opportunity to consult with counsellors in the registration area at the time of registration.

#### MATURE STUDENT ENTRY

Students proceeding on diploma programs will be required to complete the College Preparatory Program or its equivalent, unless secondary school completion is waived on a mature-entry basis.

Canada Manpower maintains an office at the College for career counselling and job placement.

# Instructions Prior to Entering Registration Area

#### IMPORTANT!

- Registration is not complete until fees have been paid.
- Post-dated cheques will not be accepted.
- If fees are to be paid by an agency, department of government, or trust company, bring a letter of authority for invoicing.

RETURNING STUDENTS who have attended Vancouver City College before have been assigned a permanent registration number at a previous registration. Registration admission tickets for returning students are *pink* and bear a letter indicating registration group. Prospective registrants should wait in the cafeteria until their registration group is paged.

#### BRING WITH YOU TO REGISTRATION:

- (1) money for fees
- (2) pink ticket of admission
- (3) past Statement(s) of Marks
- (4) secondary school transcript (if necessary)

Your pink ticket of admission is not valid without your Statement(s) of Marks. If you plan to take a course which has a prerequisite, you must bring to registration the proof that you have completed the prerequisite. A copy of your College transcript may be substituted for lost Statements of Marks. Transcripts may be obtained from the Student Services Centre in advance of registration (fee 50c).

FOR NEW STUDENTS who have *not* attended Vancouver City College before: Registration admission tickets for new students are *green* and bear a permanent registration number. *Your permanent registration number is important!* It remains with you throughout your College career. It is used to identify and locate marks, permanent records, etc. Prospective new students should wait in the cafeteria until their permanent registration number is paged. The first group called will be numbered 673-0001 to 673-0050; the second, 673-0051 to 673-0100, and so on.

- (1) money for fees
- (2) transcript of your secondary record and other appropriate educational documents
- (3) green ticket of admission

Both ticket and transcripts are essential for registration.



## Scheduling

Course offerings are subject to change. Blackboards in the registration area will show class sections closed and new sections opened. It is the responsibility of the student to enrol in courses which fit a desired program. Should conflicts occur, alternative courses or timetables must be considered.

Instructors' names are offered for the convenience of students. Section changes are permitted only in exceptional circumstances.

Students accepted for technical programs will receive pre-prepared, packaged cards to enter class. Their timetables and class cards may be obtained at the technical registration table.

#### Fees

#### COLLEGE FEES (FALL TERM)

College Arts and Science Program:

\$20 per course to a maximum of \$100.

College Preparatory Program (day):

\$20 per course to a maximum of \$100.

College Technical Programs:

\$20 per course to a maximum of \$75. The lab fee surchage in the Art and Merchandising program is \$15.

Non-resident fee - Applicable for 3:30 p.m. - 10:00 p.m. attendance — \$5 per course, in addition to regular course fee.

Late fee—If permission granted for enrolment — \$2 per course.

Student Services fee - Applies to students registered for four or more courses — \$2 per term.

Student Society Fee-Applies to all students-\$1 per term.

#### Procedure for Withdrawal From a Course

So that the College may maintain an accurate record of its overall program, each student who is withdrawing frim a course or courses or from the College, or is changing his program, MUST complete a Change of Program form at the Student Services Centre.

A student making such a change is charged tuition for a course or courses until he registers withdrawal on a Change of Program form.

Refunds are based on the scale as set out on Page 19 of the College Calendar.

# FIELD SCIENCES AND METHODS 22

(August, 1968)

A new course (three term hours' credit) is proposed in the techniques of scientific area analysis for business, pure sciences and social sciences and in the art of field observation. The course will consist of two weeks of intensive field study and discussion during the month of August (1968 session at Hope, B.C.).

Each student will be required to: (a) study basic introductory field sciences — landform, survey, map-reading, air photo interpretation, field interview techniques, etc. (b) do special study in *one* field science, e.g. ecology, market analysis, soils, social survey, etc. (c) write a report on this special area of study (d) actively participate in studies and discussions in all special areas.

Prerequisites—Satisfactory completion of College first year in Geography or Life Sciences or Social Sciences or Business or equivalent. Maximum enrolment: 30 students.

Applications must be made by January 31, 1968 for the 1968 session. Detailed information will be available in the Fall Term through class instructors and counsellors.
