Alice in Malaysia

Alice Wong attended Asia's First Regional Business Meeting for Women in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia from December 12 to 14, 1994. The conference was entitled "The Woman Manager and Entrepreneur Symposium: Asia 2000." Alice was invited because of her earlier involvement as a VCC representative, testing training modules with a Malaysian audience in 1992.

In the Symposium, she did a joint presentation with two other colleges to market a series of training packages for Malaysian women entrepreneurs. The highlight of the conference was the launching of the Women's Institute of Management (Malaysia) (WIM) and the signing by the Malaysian Minister for National Unity of a memorandum of understanding with three Canadian community colleges: VCC, Sheridan College and the University College of the Cariboo. They have made arrangments to deliver a broad range of training packages through the Institute (WIM). VCC was represented by Dale Dorn, Vice President of Education. Both the Deputy Prime Minister of Malaysia and the High Commissioner of Canada (Malaysia) were present to witness this special occasion.

Fast Forward Educational Media Showcase at Capilano


