At the December 14, 1994 VCC Board meeting, the representative of the Canadian Federation of Students asked the Board for their stance on the CFS call for a National Day of Strike and Action on January 25, 1995 in response to the Axworthy Report.

At the November Board meeting, Board members had expressed their opposition to

the Axworthy proposal to cut funding to post secondary education and specifically the implementation of an income contingency loan repayment scheme. In keeping with these resolutions, the Board requested that all students be notified in the College newsletter that the rally will take place at 1:00 p.m. at the Vancouver Art Gallery and that students will not be penalized by the College for being absent from class in order to take part in the January 25 activities.

This will be a regular work day for all faculty and staff.

A some of you are aware, the graphic arts complement of staff for both colleges was reduced last year by 66%. Since that time, the demand for services has decreased by only 20%, therefore coordination is essential in order to maintain the service at the current level and maximize scarce human resources.

Due to economic factors, the graphic arts service at both colleges continues to be a shared service coordinated by Langara College for both colleges. The services include graphics and photography in three areas: instructional, logistical (facilities), and public relations. ALL graphics jobs for instructional programs, International Education, Contracts, Continuing Education, Public Relations, and Administration must be coordinated through Media Services, and cannot be directly contracted to outside providers. The Coordination is needed to accomplish the following objectives:


- assign work effectively to the appropriate artist;

- obtain favourable rates with printers and other suppliers.


