Job market demand for VCC steel detailers creates oxymoron for unemployed

Vancouver Community College provides the only full-time drafting program in North America devoted completely to the discipline of Steel Detailing, yet the College is unable to keep up with the job market demand for graduates and has difficulty filling this program each year. The local market could easily take in three times as many steel detailers as VCC graduates.

"In most other technical areas employment has been up and down, but the demand for steel detailers has remained constant through the last decade," says VCC Instructor Bill West. "Any qualified person interested in Steel Detailing as a career is virtually assured of employment."

The Drafting - Architectural, Steel Detailing and CADD (Computer Aided Design Drafting) program runs for 12 months beginning in September. A maximum of 18 students are introduced to the unique properties of steel as a construction material through the technical drawing realm of steel detailing.

"There must be 10,000 mechanically inclined unemployed or under-employed people in Greater Vancouver who would be breaking down our doors if they knew they could invest one year preparing for a challenging career with an on-going continent-wide demand," exclaims West. "VCC's low enrolment in this program is an anomaly to me."

Granville Market

Granville Market, the linchpin of a vibrant community, is located on the south shore of False Creek. Entering the market, I glimpse massive, yellowed, sand-blasted beams and machinery, reminders of a by-

gone era. Jostled by a tightly-packed, multi-ethnic crowd, I begin my sense-provoking tour. The tangy and sweet smell of fruit and vegetables is the first assault on my nostrils. Vivid hues of green, yellow, purple, orange and red remind me of an artist's palette. Pungent fish odours recall memories of buying salmon on the Steveston docks. Many coloured herbs and spices

come into focus. Their peppery and sharp odours evoke images of the East. Strolling along I pass chocolate stands, their fragrances tempting. The butcher shops do a brisk trade. Amid the hubbub, choppers are chopping; meat is being sliced. Freckled sausages are weighed by a brawny-armed butcher. Black puddings hang out in long, braided lines. Delicatessens offer buttery, smooth-tasting cheeses and leathery-looking smoked meats. Poul-

try, wines, nuts and maple syrup may be purchased. Bake shops lure me with the smell of freshly-baked bread. Fat rye loaves, black and brown, and long poppycovered baguette sticks are arrayed on

deep, open shelves. Succulent pastries and beans await eager customers. Idling over to the fast food area, I am intrigued by the aromas from within, Greek and Italian foods are to be found. Japanese, Mexican, and Ukrainian foods are also offered.

Looking out from the north side of the market, the bustling waters of False Creek offer a pleasant diversion. Graceful, shapely yachts

slip by, masts fluttering. Powerful snubnoses tugs, cables straining, pull heavily laden barges of pebbly-mounded gravel. Kayackers skim by, browned arms and faces, noses zinc-creamed. Racing canoes cut through the water, paddles dipping in unison, amid the shouts of the coxswain. These are some of my impressions of Granville Market.

VCC signs with CANCOPY

VCC has entered into an agreement with CANCOPY, a Canadian reproduction rights agency which will greatly simplify the procedure for the photocopying and distribution of copyright-protected print materials. Instructors will be able to photocopy and distribute materials to students, create course packs for sale in the Bookstore and place photocopied articles on the reserve in the Library without the lengthy approval process from individual publishers that was required in the past.

As with any agreement, there are restrictions and conditions. To make the college community fully aware of rights and responsibilities accruing under the agreement, instructors and staff will be receiving explanatory brochures in their mailboxes soon. Posters will also be distributed for mounting at each every college photocopier outlining rights and restrictions. Librarians will be available to conduct workshops for your department to elaborate on details and answer questions.

We're very pleased that increased access to copyright-protected materials will be available to VCC. Please monitor this space *Connections* for further information concerning CANCOPY and workshop scheduling.
