enormous success

t its fourth annual CCA Day on January 25, the College and Career Access Department showcased its broad menu of self-paced courses in a riot of banners, bulletin boards, baked goodies and hot beverages.

Visitors, sponsors and counsellors from MSTL, HRDC, Douglas College, The Open Learning Agency, BCIT and local high schools enjoyed information-sharing and guided tours throughout the day, provided by the host faculty, decked out in black t-shirts. Under the banner, "Helping Adult Learners Meet Today's Challenges," the department reaffirmed its commitment to accessible, flexible and fast-paced upgrading programs.

In her welcome speech, Department Head, Barbara Little expressed special thanks to the combined generosity of Xerox Canada, the provincial government matching program and the VCC Educational Foundation, which will result in the installation in the classrooms of twelve state-of-the-art networked computers. Before asking CCA student, Paul Hoebrigs, to cut the ceremonial cake, Barbara also introduced two new CCA offerings, a grade 11 Technical Math and a grade 12 Women's Literature course, and announced a joint pilot project with the Basic Education Department to establish a young adults learning centre at Broadway and Commercial.

Barbara's own words best describe the department's role: "The CCA program provides alternatives to help adults meet learning needs of all kinds in today's rapidly changing economy - needs for flexibility, for accessibility, for individuality and for options."

Campaigning will take place from Monday, March 5 to Friday, March 9.



Operations Council Update

An Operations Council meeting was held on Tuesday, January 16, 1996 at 1:00 p.m. in KEC Room 5025 during which the members dealt with the following matters:

- The Terms of Reference for Operations Council were adopted.
- Lyn Lennig has developed a Learning Centre Community Card for students wishing to use the Learning Centre but who are between terms or who have applied and been accepted but have not yet begun their studies.
- VCC has now signed a licence agreement with the Canadian Copyright Licensing Agency (CANCOPY). The

agreement concerns only print copyrights. Information seminars are planned to ensure that staff and faculty understand the licencing requirements. Questions can be directed to Aphrodite Harris, Eva Sharell or Brenda Appleton.

- Sandra North will be developing a draft policy concerning ABESAP/BCSAP funding criteria for VCC.
- International Education fees for 1997 have been established at \$3500.00 per term for a full-time program, including graduation and student association fees.
- Draft No. 7 of the VCC Human Rights Policy was adopted with two minor

amendments. The Policy is now going to the Board for final approval.

- The Food Services Department is in the process of requesting proposals for the operation of food service at King Edward Campus.
- A draft policy-making process was presented to Council. All suggestions, comments and/or questions should be directed to Sarah Lucas for presentation at the next meeting of the Policy Committee.

The next meeting of Operations Council will take place on Tuesday, Feb. 13, 1:00 p.m. in CC Room 240.

OJAC (Online Journal Access) enables all VCC users who have a valid student, faculty or staff Library card to order articles from journals held at UBC, SFU, UVic and other post-secondary institutions in B.C. Articles of interest can be located by searching the SFU Library Databases available through the GATEWAY option on the computer catalogue main menu. Databases available for searching include ABI/Inform, The Applied Science & Technology Index, Canadian Business & Current Affairs (CBCA), The Education Index, The Humanities and Social Sciences Index and several others. Articles are usually delivered to the campus library in a matter of days. Full details and instructions are available at the Information Desk of your campus library.


