Education leading to employment: survey

ost students find work after college skills upgrade. A survey of 20,000 B.C. college and institute shows that 83 per cent of all respondents found that the education they received met their original enrollment needs, and 78 per cent were employed within a year of leaving school.

The annual study surveyed students who completed their education in 1994. The survey asked about students' education and workplace goals, the industry in which they work, their occupation, wage, geographical location, and their views of the effectiveness of the education and training they received. It found that:

- 73 per cent of all students who studied career, technical and vocational programs were employed in jobs directly related to their training.
- 71 per cent of all students who studied academic programs or took university transfer courses found work.
- 69 per cent of all employed respondents said their studies were very useful or somewhat useful in getting a job.
- 83 per cent of respondents who studied career, technical and vocational programs said their studies were very or somewhat useful in getting a job.
- 57 per cent of all respondents cited job skills as the main reason for enrolling in their program, 26 per cent cited attainment of a degree, and 17 per cent cited other reasons.

"This year's results confirm the direction this sector is headed with their recently announced strategic plan - a plan that will ensure our colleges and institutes continue to provide students across BC with the skills and knowledge they need to compete in a global economy." said Moe Sihota, BC Minister of Education, Skills and Training.

Beware of 809 area code scam

Be on the lookout for emails or calls asking you to telephone an 809 area code number. These may be "pay-per-call" numbers that can cost you easily \$100 or more per call. This scam has been identified by the National Fraud Information Center. It works by requesting you call an 809 area code number regarding an important or urgent matter. Should you get such a request, be wary, as it may be part of this scam. Unlike the 900 "pay-per-call" service, 809 calls are not required by law to warn you of the expense in advance.
