#### Viruses

Some of VCC's computers have been infected, at various times, with software viruses. Some of these viruses are harmless, others can cause damage to computer files.

ICS is deploying various anti-virus programs throughout VCC computer systems. One of these programs is a windows based scanner that is activated by the end-user. We are also implementing network based scanning.

Scanning of local hard drives from the network will occur once or twice a week. The scan will occur, after logging into the Novell network, and should only take a few minutes at most.

This should help us reduce the overall amount of virus infections.

## Voice mail power: use the system to your maximum advantage

Voice mail can stretch your time and abilities, but it can only stretch people's patience if you don't use it correctly. Follow these tips:

### When leaving a message on voice mail:

- Instead of "please call," leave a detailed message that's concise but complete.
- Offer a convenient time for the person to call you back, or state when you plan to call again.

### When using your own voice mail:

 Always provide an option to get out of voice mail and talk to a live person.

- Change your message when you go on vacation or plan to be away from your desk more than a few hours.
- Let callers know when you'll be back and who else they can talk to in the meantime.
- Call yourself up and listen to your own greeting. Do you sound inviting or monotonous? Practice until your message sounds relaxed and comfortable.
- Follow the "Sundown rule": Whenever possible, return calls the same business day.

### New curriculum to be field tested

We are seeking ABE/ ESL instructors who are interested & in field

testing a new curriculum which we have developed for VCC students, called Staying Afloat: Lifeskills and English for ABE or ESL Students. David Tickner has been seconded by the Association for Canadian Community Colleges (ACCC) for eighteen months to work on a project in Bangladesh.

Two faculty members from the Wuxi University of Light Industry, China completed two months training at VCC as part of an ACCC/VCC project. The individuals and departments involved included Terry Mills (Traffic, Customs and Transportation), Jennifer House (Teacher Training), Bob Aitken (Instructor Diploma Program) and Alice Wong (China Project Manager).

Pat Bawtinheimer hosted a meeting to discuss the feasibility of offering a laboratory technician program in Hong Kong in cooperation with the University College of the Cariboo, St. Paul's Hospital and several other organizations.

Fred Wuhrer visited Japan to negotiate next year's contract with Kansai College and to make arrangements to bring twenty students to KEC for ESL studies.

Bob Aitken designed and delivered a two week training program in Vancouver for a group of trainers from Polski Telecom, the Polish Telephone Company.

Fred Wuhrer met with officials of King Mongkut's Institute of Technology (KMIT) in Thailand to authorize KMIT to market VCC's Summer English Language and English Teacher Training programs in Thailand. The latter program was developed by Jennifer House to address the specific needs of the Government of Thailand.

Lorraine Marigold, Pam Ottridge and Yvonne Chuen are in the process of finalizing the transfer arrangements between VCC's ESL and Kwantlen's university transfer program.

Fred Wuhrer and Charles Mossop (University College of the Cariboo) met in

Malaysia with officials of Inpen College to explore the feasibility of establishing a consortium to assist in the delivery of technical and vocational training in Malaysia.

Stephanie Jewell, Fred Wuhrer and an International Student made a short presentation on IE to the VCC Board on October 24, 1996.

John Cruickshank and Moira MacLeod met with the Registrar of the Singapore Regional English Language Centre to explore professional development opportunities for VCC faculty.

Cecily May represented the Canadian Bureau of International Education (CBIE) in Mexico on a panel for internationalizing Canadian post secondary institutions.

Delegations recently hosted included a group of college officials from Malaysia and several Latin American consuls.

On November 25, 1996, SCOET (Standing Committee on Educational Technology), the Centre for Curriculum, Transfer and Technology and the Ministry of Education, Skills and Training announced the launch of SEEDS: Cultivating Educational Technologies.

SEEDS is a website that outlines how instructional design and instructional delivery can be linked with technology to improve communications and access for learners.

The site provides an overview with examples and resources on how to get started. SEEDS offers educators web access to training modules on using the World Wide Web, interactive video conferencing and computer-mediated communications for the teaching and learning processes.

Each module includes a moderated HyperNews forum where participants can pose questions, comments and suggestions. This interactive forum provides a way to find out what colleagues are doing throughout the province and potentially around the globe.
