# LINC classes to move to KEC Campus

s of August 5, 1997, all LINC classes will move from KEC North to the

East Broadway campus.

For the past several years, a small number of part-time LINC classes have been scheduled at the East Broadway campus. The number has increased over time, with now 70% of all LINC classes taking place at the East Broadway campus as of June 1997, with the remaining 30% still held at KEC North. Once the move is completed on August 5, over 600 students will attend LINC classes at KEC Broadway.

Planning for the move is well under way, and will take place on weekends so as not to interrupt classes at both KEC and KEC North. The move also includes the relocation of one audio lab and one computer lab, which will both be housed near the ESL Vocational office at KEC. The labs will be moved one at a time, a week apart, so as to minimize the amount of time the labs are out of use for students. One of the LINC labs will be functioning at all times.

As an interim solution until space planning for the entire College is completed, office space for 30 LINC instructors will be created in the Administration area of the 4th floor at KEC. The offices of Dale Dorn and Linda Martin will move to the 5th floor at KEC. Over the summer VCC will hire a space utilization consultant who will make specific recommendations regarding long-term space usage at both main campuses.



Word comes with Microsoft Office at a minimal cost whereas WordPerfect costs a little

extra. However, in cases where there is a strong preference, WordPerfect is available and supported.
