New policy announcement

Post Emergency Intervention Policy

Effective Date: November 1, 1997 Policy Category: Administration Number: A.3.4

Policy Sponsor: Human Rights Coordinator

Purpose

VCC will provide intervention and support to employees and students affected by an emergency situation if such an incident occurs on campus or includes people involved in VCC-related activities.

Policy

Vancouver Community College (VCC) is committed to establishing a safe and secure environment for all employees and students. Recognizing that people may be traumatized by a variety of events, this protocol is intended to deal with those incidents which occur on campus or include people involved in VCC-related activities. This initial support is intended to mitigate adverse psychological effects and accelerate recovery.

Applies to

All VCC employees and students.

Procedures:

- 1. To request a post emergency intervention:
 - a) During regular office hours call the Technical Coordinator* or, if unavailable, the Team Coordinator*;
 b) After office hours or weekends
 - b) After office hours or weekends call VCC Security at local 8361 or 7335;
 - c) Provide details of the incident.
- 2. Response to a post emergency intervention request:

The Technical Coordinator* and the Team Coordinator* will:

- a) determine the appropriateness of a post emergency intervention;
- b) decide whether the required intervention/services are already available within existing services provided by the College, i.e., Counselling, Health Services and, if so, initiate a referral.
- c) notify the team members, if necessary, to determine their availability to participate or assist with a post emergency intervention;
- d) request additional resources from the community at large when the intervention is beyond the capacity of the available VCC team members;
- e) inform the VCC Executive, where necessary, of the situation and the intervention which is planned.

Responsibilities

- 1. The **Technical Coordinator**, who is appointed by the President, will administer and coordinate the technical aspects of the program. The Technical and Team Coordinators will develop and maintain a Post Emergency Intervention manual.
- The Team Coordinator, who is appointed by the President, will supervise the clinical aspects of the Post Emergency Intervention program. The Team and Technical Coordinators will develop and maintain a Post Emergency Intervention manual.
- 3. The Post Emergency Intervention
 Team of volunteer employees who
 have participated in specialized P.E.I.
 training, will assist with post emergency interventions when called upon
 to do so.
- Every person at VCC who knows of an emergency situation has the responsibility to notify the Technical Coordinator* as soon as possible.

Definitions

1. Critical Incident/(Emergency Situation):

A traumatic event which is outside of the ordinary range of human experience. Such events are usually sudden and powerful incidents. These occurrences can have a strong emotional impact which is sufficient to overwhelm the usually effective coping skills of either an individual or group.

2. Critical Incident Stress

The emotional, physical, cognitive and behavioural reactions, signs and symptoms experienced by a person or group in response to a critical incident or emergency situation. It is a normal response to an abnormal situation. It can lead to psychological stress and anxiety which subsequently may result in poor work performance, family stress, personality shifts and a variety of other problems.


