

# TO THE TEACHER

In preparing Scanning A Local Newspaper, exercises have been developed which adult ESL and literacy students will find interesting and relevant to their lives as consumers. Students will also learn to scan non-prose parts of the newspaper with increasing speed. These exercises are intended to be snappy and easy to use.

This book was first written for and tested with adult Lower Intermediate ESL students at King Edward Campus, Vancouver Community College using Vancouver newspapers. However, Scanning A Local Newspaper could also be used at higher or lower ESL levels or with adult literacy classes. Similar exercises could be developed from newspapers in your town.

#### **Procedure for Teaching Scanning**

The exercises in this book are arranged from easiest to most difficult. Students can be asked to complete increasingly difficult exercises in a time limit of, say, four minutes\* by starting at the beginning of the book and working through the exercises in order - two or three per day. The following five steps take about fifteen minutes.

- 1. Have students open their books to the correct page and then turn their books face down.
- 2. Explain where and how answers are written on the "Answer and Progress Sheets." (You may want to make a photocopy of this page for each student before class.)
- 3. When you say "start" have students turn their books face up and work as quickly as possible to find answers to questions.
- 4. After four minutes, say "stop".
- 5. Have students mark their answers in groups of three or four. They must reach a consensus and should verify their answers by pointing to the part of the ad that contains the answer. Have groups of students prove their answers to you occasionally. Point out when other groups have reached a different consensus.
- \* Four minutes works well for most Lower Intermediate classes but you may want to change the time to accommodate your class.

#### Other Ways to Use the Book

- 1. After students have completed Exercise 1, have students interview each other and then display the information.
  - a. Using Figure 1 as a guide, have students interview a partner.
  - b. Have students write up the information.
  - c. Add photos to the information by having students bring a picture from home or by bringing a camera to class and having students photograph each other.
  - d. Put up a "Smile of the Day" bulletin board or, alternatively, "publish" the results in a book.
- 2. Use exercise 9 or 15 on cars as a pre-reading or pre-writing exercise.
  - a. Have students do the exercise and mark it.
  - b. Discuss cars students own, whether or not they like them, why they bought them, how they bought them, and what their ideal car would be.
  - c. Have students read a story about cars or write a composition about cars.
- 3. Use an exercise from the book as a model for a similar exercise from a more recent or more local paper. Then have other classes complete the student-made exercises.
  - a. Get a set of recent local newspapers and then select ads which match those in the book. If you can find more than one match, groups can work on different ads.
  - b. Have students do the exercise from the book and mark it.
  - c. Have pairs of students make up a similar exercise about ads in their newspaper.

- 5. Use an ad as a stimulus for a dialogue.
  - a. Have students do and mark an exercise about a consumer product, for example, Exercise 3, 11, 22 or 24.
  - **b.** Have pairs of students make up a phone dialogue inquiring about an item in the ad, a dialogue between friends or spouses considering buying an item, or a dialogue between a salesperson and a customer.
- 6. Have students write their own classified ads.
  - a. Have students do Exercise 6, 9, 11, 19, 20, 23, or 25 and mark it.
  - b. Have students look for and then discuss any abbreviations they don't understand. The Standard Abbreviations Chart in figure 8 will help them figure out what many abbreviations mean.
  - c. Have students write their own ads.
  - **d.** Using the Index in Figure 13, have students decide whether their ad would fit in Section One of *The Buy and Sell*.




