### CITY CENTRE DIVISION CHAIR - TECHNICAL DIVISION

The Division includes six departments Building Service Worker; Computer Graphics; Drafting; Electronics; Jewellery; Printing Production. There are approximately twenty-one programs within these departments.

Responsible to the Dean of Instruction

Position includes four fundamental areas of responsibility:

- design and implementation of systems leading to the highest quality of programs, curriculum, and instruction
- design and implementation of systems leading to the recruitment and upgrading of faculty and Department Heads
- development of short and long range plans for the Division and its various reporting constituents
- ♦ administration of various reporting, control and evaluation functions
