MY DAY AT V.V.I

On Friday I spent a day in Mon's school than at my school. First of all, the teachers are called instructors and they are called by their first name. My mom's recess is called a coffee break and lasts 30 min, and there is no buzzer to tell you when coffee and lunch break start & end.
