
#### Rea 's Departure Unhinges Library Staff!



### Homes Needed For Visiting Students



Every year for the past six years, Kirsten and Murray Oickle of Richmond have had an addition to their family. And even though their newest family members usually only stay with them a summer, the bonds carry over time and milles. By taking visiting students into their home, and hearts, they and other families in the greater Vancouver area have helped make Vancouver Community College's HOMESTAY program a real success story.

HOMESTAY began 21 years ago. Since then, thousands of overseas and out-of-province students have enjoyed the hospitality of local families as they learn the English language as well as west coast culture. Students spend a portion of their stay studying English at Vancouver Community College - Langara campus. They also learn about Canadian lifestyles through a mix of recreational and social activities. An important element is taking part in Canadian family life.

That is where people like the Oickles come in. In addition to support and friendship families provide the students with a home for the summer, including meals an a room of their own. "Both of our families are back east, and we wanted to have people around," says Kirsten. "The students become part of our family. They love everything, and it's such an exciting time for them. That makes it fun for us. (They are) No trouble at all," says Kirsten when asked about the task of providing meals for a foreign guest. "I only had one Japanese girl who couldn't seem to tolerate vegetables, fish or meat," she recalls with a laugh. "But as long as I fed her hamburgers, pizza and hot dogs, she was thrilled."

For their efforts, families are reimbursed \$20 a day per student, with a maximum of two students per household. Still, the real reward is in shared cultures and lifetime friendships.
