What is the Michelangelo Virus & why should you care?

It's a "virus" that will trash your personal computer's hard drive and send all the information contained on it into the ozone never to be recovered again. What is a "virus"?

A "virus" is computer language for a piece of programming that is spread from hard drive to hard drive by means of floppy diskettes without the knowledge of the operator. This "virus" affects all **International Business Machines Corp. and IBM-compatible personal computers** that rely on the


computer standard operating system know as DOS.

How is it spread?

Anytime a floppy disk is inserted into your hard drive and the information is read or information is written to the disk the "virus" is able to "infect" your computer's hard drive.

Is your hard drive "infected"?

The only way to know if your hard drive has "caught the virus" is to check the hard drive with a piece of computer software called SCAN. This software is available from John Roberts in ICS at local 8369.

Is there a cure?

Yes! Take a formatted diskette to John Roberts and he will supply you with a copy of the SCAN software. Once you run this software on your hard drive it will tell you if your hard drive has any "viruses" and will give you directions on how to remove them. It will also allow you to "clean" all your floppy diskettes, and check any diskettes that may come from other users to prevent recontamination.

Should I act on this right away?

Only if you value the programs and information you currently have on your hard drive. Remember that once a hard drive crashes it's too late!

Welcome to a New Citizen




Under the Weather!



BLAIR'S MUM'S (ALVINA FRIESEN) CRUMB CAKE

Ingredients

2 cups flour	1 cup white sugar
3/4 cup butter or margarine (melted)	1 cup sour milk*
1 tsp. soda**	1 egg
1 tsp. cinnamon	1 tsp. cloves
	1 tsp. nutmeg

*To sour milk, place 1 tbsp. of white vinegar in measuring cup. Top off with milk to measure 1 cup in total

**Dissolve soda into the sour milk.

Directions:

Combine flour & sugar. Mix well. Add melted butter. Rub to crumbs and save. Take out one cup of crumbs and set aside. To the remaining crumb mixture, add all the other ingredients. Mix well. Pour into an 11" greased pan. Sprinkle the cup of crumbs on top of the cake. Bake in 375 degree oven for 30 minutes.
