
John Bassani, auction winner of the giant chocolate Santa and gingerbread scene, generously



Now, under the auspices of the Educational Foundation, the association has one part-time coordinator, **Katja**Pantzar, who can be reached at local 7147.



Trevor Sawkins was awarded the 1991 KEC Scholarship to carry out a self-designed, 8-month project of language and culture studies in Indonesia.






