Your junk may be someone else's treasure!

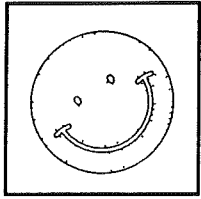

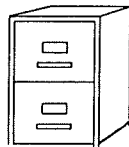

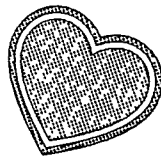

Why don't you pick a card, a box of chocolates, a stuffed animal, or flowers for *your loved one*.

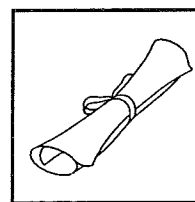
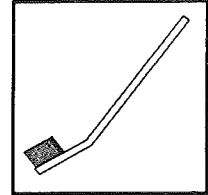

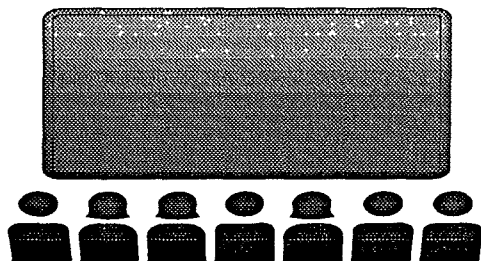

Please note that if there is not sufficient registration in a workshop, the workshop will be cancelled.

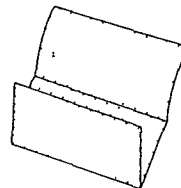

Pitney Bowes tells us that two machines for folding letters belong to City Centre Campus. I have never seen either of those machines.



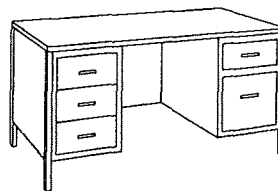
A large free box of envelopes is being offered for information leading to the discovery of either of these machines!!!

### ***SETTING UP AN OFFICE AT HOME***

Ideally, your home office should be a separate room, but if one isn't available, choose a corner that will belong to you and you alone. If necessary, invest in partitions to separate yourself psychologically from the rest of the house.



In selecting an area, consider whether there is enough space for a desk and other equipment. Is there a convenient electrical outlet and telephone jack? (if not, they can be installed.)

Your desk needn't be a 'desk' at all. All you really need is a surface to write on. Whatever you choose, it should be sturdy and a comfortable height.


A hollow door resting on two file cabinets provides plenty of drawer space and a good-sized desktop at just the right height.

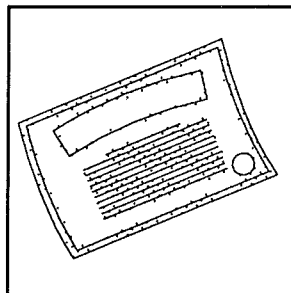

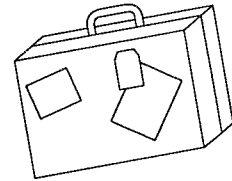

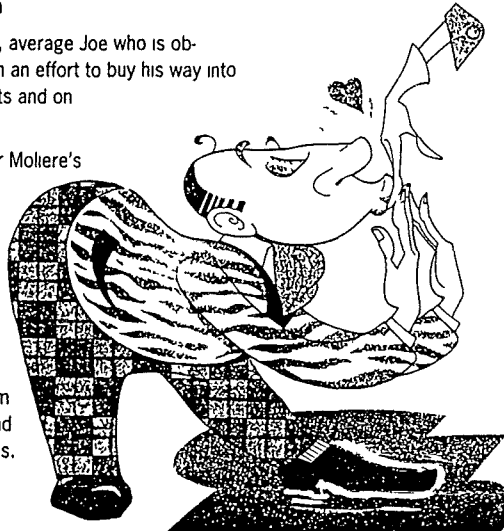
**CAN YOU DIG IT?** STUDIO 58 is presenting **THE KAT WHO WOULD BE KOOL**, a 1950's adaptation of Moliere's **The Bourgeois Gentleman**

The Kat in question is Monsieur Jourdain, a not so bright, average Joe who is obsessed with being Kool, one of the creme de la creme. In an effort to buy his way into high society he blows wads of money on outlandish outfits and on teachers to educate him in the finer arts.

Beatniks, Bee-boppers and Blowhards are all subjects for Moliere's satiric wit and keen observation of human foibles.

**LLOY COUTTS** (director) returns to **STUDIO 58** where she directed **THE WORKROOM** in 1988. Other credits include **WORLDS AWAY?** and **INNERSPEAK** for the Workman Theatre in Toronto, **THE DOUBLE BASS**, **THE LAST BUS** and **DOTESTAD** for the Tarragon Theatre, Toronto.

Born in Paris in 1622, **MOLIERE** changed his career from law to the theatre in his early twenties. In his own time and through the ages, he has been considered a comic genius. Moliere's best known works include **THE MISER**, **TARTUFFE**, **THE MISANTHROPE**, **THE SCHOOL FOR WIVES** and the **IMAGINARY INVALID**.
