INSTRUCTIONAL SKILLS WORKSHOP AT VCC

The Instructional Skills Workshop (ISW) is an excellent professional development activity for anyone who takes an active role in the

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instruction of students. Working with a small group of colleagues, each participant designs and instructs mini lessons which are video taped. Colleagues who have been trained a s facilitators guide constructive feedback. The result is positively enhanced awareness of how to teach and learn. It is an opportunity to share ideas about teaching and learning with others in a nonjudgmental framework.

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Two successful Instructional Skills Workshops (ISWs) were held at VCC this past May. **Participants** included instructors, librarians, a n d instructional assistants from Langara and King Edward Campus. The four trained facilitators were instructors from Langara, King Edward Campus and UBC. The organizers from King Edward Campus and City Centre Campus were supported by the VCC Human Resource Development Department.
