## **EASY VOICEMAIL** ACCESS!

Mitel has recently implemented a new access code for Voicemail. your own telephone set you may access your voicemail box by simply entering 8\*. The telephone system sends the voicemail system vour extension number as the mailbox to access, you will then be prompted for your This feature passcode. only works from your own telephone set; therefore, if you are accessing your voicemail from box elsewhere at the two colleges, must you continue to use the original code 80\*XXXX, where X is your personal mailbox number. Take care that vou do not use 8\* from another person's phone as you run the risk of locking mailbox their up entering invalid passcodes.

As well, recently requested that the Voicemail box passcode be lengthened to six (6) digits. If you have not done so already, please do.

# To change your passcode, at anytime:

Dial into your mailbox: 8\* (if calling from your own phone) or 80\*XXXX (XXXX is your mailbox number); press U (8 key for User Options); press P (7 key for Passcode); kev in new six digit passcode. Wait. voicemail will announce back to you your new code. Press X (9 key to exit User Options); press X (9 key to exit your mailbox).


