TEACHING LEARNING OPPORTUNITY IN CHINA

SHANGHAI EAST CHINA NORMAL UNIVERSITY EDUCATIONAL

The Shanghai East China Normal University is looking for four Canadian ESL teachers for a two-month position in Shanghai. One instructor is needed for a beginning level class, two for intermediate classes and one for an advanced class. The Canadian teachers would receive three days per week of Chinese language instruction and exchange would instruct ESL classes three days per week to the Chinese students.

Room and board are provided in an air conditioned hotel room with a private bathroom. 1500 Chinese yuan (approximately \$200 US) will be paid each month as pocket money. The instructors will pay their own return air fare.

The program will start July 5, 1994 in Shanghai. Apparently a visa can be obtained quickly from the Chinese Embassy in Vancouver.



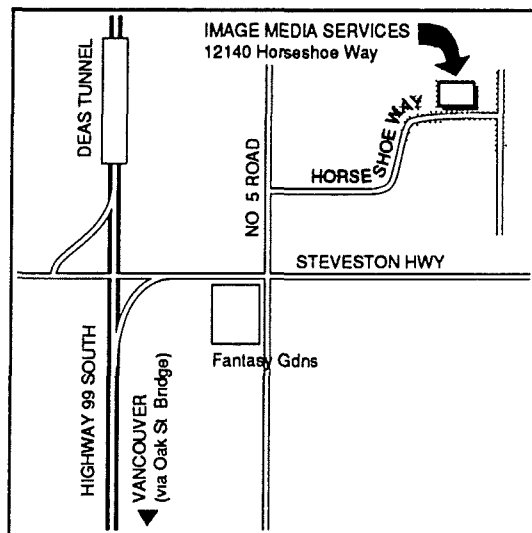

ACCC 1995 Conference in Victoria, B.C.


CALL FOR PRESENTATIONS
