ecember 14, 1999 marked the 20th anniversary of the Homefront Learning program, part of the ESL Outreach Department at KEC. Tutors, students, faculty and staff involved in the program over the last 20 years joined in an evening of celebration.

The event was held in the faculty lounge at KEC. Greetings and short speeches of welcome were made by President Dale Dorn, Moira Macleod, Dean of Academic and Development Programs and Marta Gardiner, Associate Dean of ESL. Following that, everyone dug into the enormous multicultural potluck dinner. After dinner, Rosemarie Watson, past Department Head of Outreach, spoke of the history of the Homefront Program.

Homefront Learning was the brainchild of Rosemary Meyer, Division Chair of ESL in 1979. Her vision was that VCC should reach out and into the homes of ESL learners who could not attend classes on campus. Some learners have physical

disabilities which prevent them from going to school, others are women isolated at home with babies and small children, and some learners cannot attend ESL classes because of shift work or changing work schedules. Volunteer tutors are recruited and trained, then matched with a learner. ESL learners are tutored free of charge in their own home.

Helen McDonald, a tutor in the program since 1991, and Donna Neufeld, a recently trained tutor, both spoke with enthusiasm on how tutoring makes a difference in their students' lives as well as enriching the lives of the tutors.

Today Homefront is a thriving and growing community-based program with


