

Manuel Salinas - A Man for all Seasons

Many of you will remember Manuel Salinas with great fondness and admiration. He was a student at King Edward Campus in the Visually Impaired Program and in College and Career Access from February 1992 to December 1996. He served as President of KESA and was the first student representative on the College Board. Manuel passed away at the age of 50 on October 16, 2000. We are grateful to Aphrodite Harris and Amanda Palacios who have prepared the following tribute to Manuel.

Manuel Salinas was trained as an engineer at the most prestigious technical university in Chile. He left his homeland after the military coup in Chile that occurred in 1973.

People in the library came to know Manuel as a mature VCC student. Due to an industrial accident that affected his vision, he came to VCC to gain the necessary skills to reintegrate into the workforce.

Manuel Salinas was dear to the library for many reasons. We knew him as a student seeking materials for his assignments as well as in his capacity as a community worker and KESA member. In each encounter in the library, Manuel radiated enthusiasm, optimism and a true and deep caring for all human beings. Indeed, after talking with Manuel for a few moments, we found his commitment to humanity to be absolutely contagious.

Manuel inspired people to view the world as a place of solidarity and happiness. The phrase that his friends identified with him and that was framed at his recent memorial stated:

Haciendo de la vida un placer (I am trying to make life a joy).

He used this phrase whenever he was asked how he was and what he was doing. And as we review his incredible life, we realize he exemplified that joy, and commitment, in spades.

In 1994, when Manuel heard of the plight of students who could not afford textbooks, he strongly lobbied other members of KESA to support initiatives that would increase student access to needed textbooks. Later that year as VCC found itself dealing with separation from Langara, Manuel worked tirelessly to promote and support the viability of VCC.

Manuel always envisioned a community centre for members of the Latin American community in Vancouver. Without funds or the power to realize a new centre, Manuel did not despair. He actively lobbied the Catholic Church which eventually allowed the use of some modest space on 12th Avenue for Latin American - Canadians who would now have a place to meet for discussion, education and recreational activities. With very few resources, but under Manuel's leadership and with other volunteers, families attending the centre received support and referrals to needed community services.

Manuel was active in many other areas in the community. Despite failing eyesight and limited mobility, he worked tirelessly. He was very involved both nationally and provincially with the disabled community. He was a passionate advocate for opportunities for the disabled, especially among his fellow students. He was a strong source of encouragement for women struggling for a voice, recognition and job skills. He was a mentor and source of information for the elderly and for youth.

One of the most wonderful qualities a human being can have is to listen to the concerns of others in a mindful and compassionate way. No one who had contact with Manuel was ever turned away because Manuel had the capacity to listen with both his heart and his head. As a result of these encounters, individuals would gain a tremendous sense of pride and dignity.

Manuel, you left us too soon. You will be missed by your family as a devoted father and grandfather. You will be missed by the rest of us as a source of inspiration and hope. Thank you for crossing the doors of Vancouver Community College.
