Totem Pole raising a success



A landmark event marked December 13, 2000 at Vancouver Community College's City Centre campus.

Ian Campbell, former VCC Board member and hereditary Chief of the Tsawassen Nation, led the raising of a totem pole carved by Gerry Sheena, a former student of the Jewellery Art & Design program at VCC. The totem pole stands impressively in the main hall of the building welcoming students, staff and the community to VCC.

The totem pole has three main components: the Eagle which symbolizes strength, the Tool Maker which represents a teacher and mentor imparting knowledge and the



Beaver which exemplifies an industrious spirit.

A traditional raising ceremony was reinacted with music, singing and dancing to the delight of all. Victoria Green, a VCC student, and Brenda Andrews, the First Nations Academic Advisor, had the honour of unveiling the totem pole to the many spectators present. Gerry Sheena is from the Interior Salish people and worked with four carvers from the Tsawassen nation to complete the artwork.


William Gan will be missed by all at VCC

Grants awarded to Court Interpreting Certificate Program

Continuing Education is very proud to announce the successful funding applications to the BC Law Foundation for a total of \$495,100.00 by Dr. Silvana Carr, Coordinator of the court Interpreting Certificate Program.

The grants include:

- \$45,400 to expand the Distance Education Court Interpreting program to a certificate.

- \$49,700 to expand the Legal Interpreter Training in Aboriginal Languages
- \$350,000 to create an online and print glossary of legal terminology, a plain language approach, in 7 languages for interpreters, legal service providers and the general public.
- \$50,000 which will be matched by the provincial government for court interpreting student bursaries.

Changes to Smoking Areas at VCC

At the November Operations Council meeting, concerns were raised about the ongoing problem of smoke entering the building caused by people smoking in front of air intakes and entrances. To address these concerns, an action plan was approved at the December Operations Council meeting that will restrict smoking to designated areas.

Effective February 5, smoking will be permitted in the following areas only:

KEC

- · Level 4 along the railing overlooking the Campus and under the overhang behind Second Cup from the corner of the building to the bike racks
- · Level 2 Cafeteria balcony and patio
- · Level 1 All areas on the North side of the campus with the exception of a 30-meter buffer around the daycare, receiving, back entrance and centre walkway and the entire trades parking area.

CC

- · All areas on the Cambie side of the building with the exception of a 30-meter buffer around each main Cambie Street exit.
- · The area contained within the alcove behind the Learning Centre (Once supply air vents are re-located).

All other College property is nonsmoking.

Signs are being installed throughout the outside of the campuses that clearly identifying smoking and non smoking areas. Ashtrays will be removed from all non-smoking areas





Summary of Minutes - VCC Operations Council Meeting

Chair: Mary Hoekstra December 12, 2000 KEC, Room 5025

1.0 VCC Space Committee

The Council received the minutes of the VCC Space Committee's meeting of October 12, 2000. Minutes of future meetings will be provided on regular basis for information purposes.

2.0 Environmental Committee - Annual Report

A new paper re-cycling program will be implemented at the College early in the new year. All paper products, except paper soiled with food, will be accepted in a single container which will then be sorted by the recycling company. Specially labeled boxes will be placed in every classroom and a central station will also be created for recycling of beverage containers. The goals of the new program is to reduce both paper and garbage waste substantially.

The College is also involved in an initiative by the Association of Canadian Community Colleges, in association with Energy Canada, to assist colleges in becoming part of the Energy Innovators Program and the Voluntary Climate Registry. Both programs are sponsored by the federal government to try and reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Consultants from Prism Engineering are working with VCC Facilities staff to develop a plan. The final report, which will take approximately 2 months to complete, will include goals for energy usage and recommendations on specific actions that could be taken to reduce energy consumption.

Members of the Transportation Committee have been providing input to the Skytrain project authorities about the impact of the Millennium Line on VCC.

3.0 Safer Campus - Annual Report

A report was received on the safer campus initiatives at VCC. Approximately \$25,000 of the \$80,000 originally allocated remains to be spent.

4.0 Smoking Update

Two documents, the Draft Smoke Free Policy and Smoke Free Summary and Implementation Plan, were presented. The target date to implement the approved policy is February 5, 2001. Both the Policy and the Plan will be revisited for approval in January.

5.0 Update - International Education Centre

It was reported to Council that a few renovation deficiencies are continuing to be addressed. A theft also occurred on December 11th. The perpetrators were caught on camera and the incident is being followed up on.

6.0 Proposed Draft Policy - Commercial and Privately Funded Activities

A proposed Policy on Commercial and Privately Funded Activities was presented by Frank Cosco. The Council had a lengthy discussion on the document. The Council requested that, in lieu of the policy, consideration be given to crafting a set of guidelines for review at the next meeting. These guidelines would use elements of the proposed policy, the Non-base Funded Activities Policy, the Sponsorship Policy and the CEIA Guiding Principles on Commercial Activities and Sponsorship. These guidelines, once developed, could be appended to the Non-Base Funded Activities Policy.

Kathy Kidd remembered......

It was the spring of 1998 when I ran into Kathy, characteristically on her bike, just in front of St. Andrew's Wesley. We hadn't met for some months, and there was catching up to do: Kathy had become the organ scholar at the St Andrew's and I'd just become department head in music. Before I really thought about it, I asked "So, when can we persuade you to come back to VCC?" and we were making plans.

One of this country's pre-eminent jazz pianists and composers, Kathy Kidd taught for many years with our department. By the late 1980s, she was performing at all the major Jazz festivals in Canada and was immersed in broadcasts and recording projects. In her eclectic search for inspirations, she found that she needed study away from Vancouver B months in the New York's trendy Chelsea, then an extended time in Paris. Her interaction with Carribean, South American, African and Near-Eastern musicians somehow magically became a part of her own rich personal mosaic.

When she died, far, far too soon this fall, it was news throughout Canada's musical community. At VCC we knew and treasured a further side of Kathy. Like all the best teachers, Kathy made learning seem easy and fun; but for all that, there was a solid core of values central to her vision as an educator: commitment to the nurturing of performers; concern for the special needs of women in the arts; belief in the inclusiveness of the musical experience and the spiritual dimensions of art. Technique was to be mastered, skills polished. What mattered was music.

This fall Kathy "volunteered" to put together a group for our traditional term start-up concert. Our new and returning students saw a perfect demonstration of the bewildering complexity of our performing faculty, all working out enthusiastically on a set of classic Kathy tunes, a model of talent, diversity, and co-operation. We've certainly all learned from her work and will continue to honour her ideals. But we'll miss her terribly.

7.0 Marketing Update


