# President's Update

Just over a year ago, I announced a two Vice President organizational model for VCC, which I committed to review after a one year trial period. Mary Hoekstra's recent departure, coupled with my commitment to review the organization structure and an evaluation of the work ahead of us, has led to the reorganization recently announced.

At the January Board meeting, the Board endorsed the following organizational structure for the College:

Acting Vice President Academic and Developmental Education - Moira Macleod

Acting Vice President Applied Education - Joan McArthur-Blair Acting Vice President Finance & Administration - Trish Pekeles Vice President Education Services - Linda Martin

In addition to the Academic and Developmental programs, Moira Macleod will continue to have responsibility for Library and Media Services and the Centre for Instructional Development. Joan McArthur-Blair, in addition to Applied programs, will take on the new responsibility of Continuing Education. Linda Martin will have responsibility for Student Services, Registrar's Office, Financial Aid, Fundraising, Ventures and International Enterprises, Human Rights and Marketing. The two Acting Vice Presidents Education positions were effective February 12, 2001 for a period of six to nine months. The two Dean positions vacated by Joan McArthur-Blair and Moira Macleod will not be replaced, at least in the interim, but I will be looking at the need for resources before confirming the new organizational structure. The position of Vice President Finance and Administration will be posted shortly.

This new structure will give VCC strong leadership in each area, enabling us to face the many challenges ahead. As many of you know, VCC will be embarking on a Board-initiated strategic planning process within the next few months. The VCC Feasibility Study is well under way, as is the Communications and Marketing Plan; program review was initiated recently and the Services Review Policy is in process. This increased activity is essential if we are to ensure VCC's reputation for delivery of quality programs and services that respond to the needs of the community.

I am sure that you will join me, first in thanking the two Vice Presidents who did such an outstanding job under the two Vice President model, Linda Martin and Mary Hoekstra, and secondly in wishing our new appointees a rewarding and successful career ahead.

On Monday **February 26**, 2001, join us at City Centre for the opening of the Barista Café.



VCC's Education Council has 22 members - 16 of these are elected: four students ( two from KEC, two from CC ), two support staff ten faculty members.

The Education Council meets from 3:30-5:30 p.m. on the first Tuesday of the month. It has a Curriculum Committee, a Policy Committee, and several ad hoc committees as needed; e.g. the Services Review Policy Committee.

Under the Colleges and Institutes Act, Education Council has the final word on:

Setting policies concerning exams and evaluation of student performance;

Setting policies concerning student withdrawal from courses and programs;

Setting criteria for academic standing, academic standards and grading; Setting criteria for awards recognizing academic excellence;

Setting policies and procedures for appeals by students on academic matters;

Setting curriculum content for courses leading to certificates and diplomas.

The Education Council also has the duty and right to advise the College Board on most issues and policies including (among others):

Proposals about implementation of courses or programs leading to certificates or diplomas, including the length of those courses or programs;

Priorities for implementation of new programs and courses;

Cancellation of programs or courses, or changes in the length of courses and programs;

Policies on faculty member qualifications;

Adjudication procedure for appealable matters of student discipline; Terms of affiliation with other postsecondary bodies;

Qualifications - admission policies; Criteria for awarding certificates and diplomas.

Not only does Education Council have the right and duty to advise the Board but in the past four years the Board has always taken its advice!

The College is now starting a new Strategic Planning Process that will provide new directions and processes for moulding the future of VCC. Education Council is an integral part of that process. It has a say that the Board respects.


# Smoke Free Policy a Success at VCC

# VCC Smoke-Free Policy

Effective Date: January 16, 2001 Policy Category: Administration Number: B.3.8

#### Purpose

To inform the College community of VCC's commitment to a smoke-free environment.

#### Policy

To minimize smoke from entering College buildings, smoking on VCC property is restricted to designated areas only (refer to Appendix). Clear signage will be in place to identify smoke-free and designated smoking areas. VCC will provide programs to assist and encourage employees who wish to cease smoking.

Applies to

All VCC employees, students and visitors.

#### Procedures

1. Security will patrol smoke-free areas and ensure smokers are aware of the VCC Smoke-Free policy and the location of designated smoking areas.

2. All employees have a responsibility to report non-compliance of this policy to Security or the Building Services Manager.

#### Appendix -Designated Smoking Areas

King Edward Campus

\* Level 4 - along the railing overlooking the Campus and under the overhang behind second cup from the corner of the building to the bike racks

\* Level 1 - All areas on the North side of the campus with the exception of the entire trades parking area, the centre walkway and a 30-meter buffer around the daycare, Receiving and back entrance.

City Centre Campus

\* All areas on the Cambie side of the building with the exception of a 30-meter buffer zone around each main Cambie Street exit

\* The area contained within the alcove behind the Learning Centre off Hamilton Street

### New Voluntary Life Insurance Premium Rates

The Employee Benefits Committee recently went to the marketplace with respect to underwriting the Voluntary Life Insurance plan. Sun Life of Canada, the current underwriter was found to have the best rates, and was selected to continue in this capacity. There are premium reductions for many of our employees and their spouse.

The new premium rates are based upon male/female - five year age band. The previous rates were based upon employee/spouse - ten year age band.

The insurance is available in multiples of \$10,000 to a maximum of \$300,000 if you are enrolled in the Basic Group Life Insurance Plan. The non-evidence medical maximum has been increased from \$40,000 to \$50,000 for individuals when they first become eligible to participate in the plan.


