Go Green

VCC is going Green! The purpose of the Vancouver Community College Go Green project is to raise awareness of alternatives to single occupancy vehicle transportation and the impact of traffic on communities.

Funding was provided by the former provincial government to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in BC communities. The college and the student and faculty associations have also contributed to the project, which is to be coordinated for one year, three days per week.

One very specific goal of the project is to set up negotiations for a universal transit pass for VCC students. We will help TransLink survey and study travel patterns. This will help TransLink determine the price to charge for the student pass based on filling transit capacity (the new SkyTrain is a factor to be considered) without losing revenue. Students will vote in a spring referendum to decide for or against the deal.

I look forward to further discussion of transportation alternatives with you. Please feel free to contact me with any comments or concerns. I will be working on the project each week from Monday - Wednesday. The new Director will be responsible for contributing to the overall planning of VCC's marketing and visibility strategies and creating a wide range of marketing and communications initiatives. Finance & Administration:

Smile... Employee Photo Identification is Coming to VCC

At the July Operations Council, implementation of employee photo identification was approved. As of January 1, 2002:

- all VCC employees will be required to carry College ID while at VCC and be able to present their ID to security and other employees to confirm who they are

- VCC employees working in areas other than their own department that require a key to access those areas will be required to wear photo ID while in those areas

- Individual departments will have the option of making the wearing of ID required within their department

- All employees will be required to present VCC employee ID to borrow resources from the College libraries

Employee ID will have the College Logo, the employee's picture and the employee's first and last name. Employees required to wear photo ID will have the choice of a clip-on or necklace to attach their ID.

Employee ID will not be taken during student ID times. To ensure you have your ID before January, please mark your calendar and plan to attend one of the following dates to have your Employee ID taken:

An information meeting will be offered to discuss how this innovative program can work for us.



Summary of Minutes Operations Council

Held on Tuesday, July 10, 2001 2:00 p.m. in KEC Room 5025 Acting Chair: Trish Pekeles

1. Guidelines for Commercial and Privately-funded Activities:

The Guidelines for Commercial and Privately-funded Activities, for attachment to the Non Base-funded Activities Policy, were approved at Operations Council. The "Guidelines" will be presented for input at Education Council.

2. Employee Photo ID Implementation Plan:

Operations Council approved the plan to implement employee photo I.D. cards. These cards will be mandatory for contractors and for employees with key access to departments other than their own. Further details will be available to the College community through an article in Connections and other printed notices.

- 3. The Facilities Department reports that the Smoke Free Policy is working well. The majority of employees and students are complying with the rules, and air quality in formerly problem areas has greatly improved.
- 4. The SWOT report (Successes, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats) is nearing completion. Departments will be receiving a copy of their own reports in September, with an invitation to comment and/or question. The Institutional Research Department reported that the process, overall, has been a positive one.
