

VCC Welcomes Potential Students at the Program Information Night



Do You Procrastinate When it Comes to Looking After Your Health?

The "Living a Healthy Life With Chronic Conditions" Program

What Is It?

This is a 6-week, structured course designed to help people take initiative and control over their chronic conditions such as heart disease, arthritis, diabetes, asthma, bronchitis, emphysema, fibromyalgia, chronic fatigue syndrome and all others. Family and friends are welcome to attend

How Does the Program Work?

Two trained volunteer leaders facilitate a process, meeting once a week for 2 1/2 hours, over a 6-week period where people learn skills and information about positively managing health conditions and getting the pleasure back into life.

What Will We Learn?

This is a course that focuses on how to mobilize your resources and get the information that you need. We look at goal-setting, finding and accessing community resources, and how to get more out of life despite the challenges of chronic illness. Developed and researched at Stanford.

How Much Does It Cost?

The course is FREE as it is funded by the Vancouver/Richmond Health Board. A copy of the companion book, Living a Healthy Life with Chronic Conditions is included.

Report on the College Board Meeting of September 27, 2001

The Board received an update on the College planning process The SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats) report is currently before the governance councils and will then go to the Board. The President advised that the College is still awaiting information from ITAC (Industry Training and Apprenticeship Commission) and the Ministry. This delay in forthcoming information and lack of clear indication of the Government's directions may delay the planning process somewhat.

All of the universities, colleges and institutes were asked to respond to the Government's Core Services Review. The Board approved VCC's report back to the Government.

The Board approved the Five Year Capital Plan for submission to the Ministry. The Update on Facility Expansion advised that due to the Government's freeze on capital projects, the VCC facility expansion is currently on hold.

Ken Smith, Chair of the President's Performance Assessment Committee invited input on the

President's performance for the second year review (December 1, 2000 - November 30, 2001) due in November.

The Board has established a Board Advocacy and Community Alliance Committee with a mandate for advocacy, friend raising and alliance building.

The Board approved changes in the prerequisites to the Automotive Téchnician Program, as recommended by Education Council. They also approved the Memorandum of Understanding between VCC and the Vancouver Film School, as recommended by Education Council. The proposed affiliation pertains to international students only who would upgrade their English skills and learn media specific vocabulary at VCC, in addition to studying at the Film School.

The next Board meeting will take place at 5:30 p.m on Thursday, October 25, 2001 at City Centre.

Changes in the VCC Telephone Directory

Introduction

A team of ICS staff is working on a project to simplify the process of maintaining and publishing the VCC Telephone Directory. In preparation for the publication of the 2001/2002 edition, to be published in November, we would like to verify the VCC telephone, email and location information on all employees in the database from which the directory is published.

What will change?

The end result, the Telephone Directory itself, will continue to be published annually. However, the changes being put in place will make the process of publication more straightforward, and, more importantly, the GroupWise address book will contain the same information. This means it can be used as an online directory, and will be more up-to-date than the printed version. A Web version (available internally only) will also be published.

What we need from you

Telephone Directory Data Verification Process

Over the next few days, you will receive an email from phonebookeditor@vcc.bc.ca, which lists the data associated with your network ID in the phonebook database. If any data in that email is not correct, please send a feedback email to phonebookupdate@vcc.bc ca containing the changes to the data. We will then update our database based on your feedback email. Note that we need you to describe the update data in a specific format. See the Email Feedback section below for details of the format.

If you do not receive the email, it is probable that we don't have an email address for you. This may be because you do not have a VCC email account, or may be due to an error in the system. In this case, please go to this Web page:

Here you will find the form which will enable you to look up the data

associated with your network ID If your ID is in our database, it will display your data in the resulting page If you find any incorrect data from the Web page, we request that you send a feedback email to phonebookupdate@vcc.bc.ca, containing the correcting data. Again, please see the Email Feedback Section for the update format.

If you do not receive our email and you do not find any data on your network ID from this Web page, then please go to:

http://curie.vcc.bc.ca/ics/pbnewid.html

to add your ID and data into our phonebook database. You will enter your data directly on the form and submit the form for processing. The details you enter will be added to our database soon after you submit them

The feedback email is processed by a computer program developed specifically for this purpose. This is why we have requested you submit it in a specific format. If you have any comment on this process or if you want your feedback read and dealt with by the Telephone Directory editor, please send an email message to phonebookeditor@vcc.bc.ca. Otherwise all feedback emails should follow the process outlined in the next section. Feedback email should be sent before November 4, 2001. Adding your data into the phonebook database should also be completed before November 4, 2001.

FEEDBACK Email

For updating an incorrect data element in the phonebook database, please send an email containing the correct data to phonebookupdate@vcc.bc.ca

For each correction, you should have one line in your email body, constructed in the following format.

UPDATE <Network ID> <DATA NAME> <Correction>

Each line is started at column one. The words "UPDATE" and the content of the <DATA NAME> field should all be in upper case. The <Network ID>

should be in lower case. The <Correction> is the changed data, replacing the existed data in the database. There are no spaces between each data element, and they are delimited by a semi-colon.


