
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Fiat Mode XV Highlights Student Talent


Once again, the Fashion Arts graduates demonstrated that VCC-CE continues to offer well-rounded, innovative and comprehensive training to students in the fashion industry.

We are now also able to process your PowerPoint documents and presentations. Let us know in your email which view you would like printed. If you need more than one view, and need different numbers of each, you will need to send in separate requisitions. Also, do not forget that the finishing touches to your documents, such as binding, cerloxing, or folding do require extra time. See the requisition forms for the number of days you can expect these special touches to take.

Photo ID Cards: Important Information

To improve service to you and your students, Photo ID schedules have been simplified and made more flexible.

Photo ID will now be offered on regular days at any time between 10 a m. and 6:30 p.m. Schedules from September 1 - December 19, 2002, will be posted at key locations at both City Centre and King Edward Campus. Copies of these schedules are also available for printing or consultation on the shared network drives I: and J: drives, common/ PhotoID (these are Adobe Acrobat [PDF] files so click on My Computer->I: or J: drive -> common -> photoID ->and select the folder for either KEC or CC) The posted dates and times will accommodate both students and employees.

Please ensure that your students are aware of the changes as well as the following information:

- Student ID cards are required in order to access Library services and to obtain FASTTRAX transit discount stickers from the Student Association Offices. (\$2.00 fee applies)
- Student ID cards are available to all students registered in the College Banner system.
- Students must show their registration form in order to obtain a Student ID card or expiry date sticker.
- Students may obtain their ID cards at either King Edward or City Centre Campus.
- There is no charge to obtain a Student ID card although if the card is lost or stolen, there is a \$20.00 replacement fee payable at the Cashiers' Office. The cashier will issue a new registration form which is necessary to obtain a replacement card during posted hours.

Otherwise it may be checked out or booked for days, and your students will be frustrated and out of luck.

To place a video on Reserve please go to the Information Desk or call to speak to a member of staff (KEC - 7326; CC -8339). We will help you to ensure that your students get first priority for the videos they need to do their coursework.

VCC Library Booking Procedures for Faculty

We are streamlining our booking procedures so that all faculty will have the best opportunity to book times for tours and class sessions either at the City Centre Campus Library or the King Edward Campus Library. These procedures are effective as of August 1, 2002.

TOURS

Tours are scheduled for half an hour and provide an overview of the library and its resources accompanied by a walk-around.

CLASS SESSIONS

Class sessions, after consultation with the instructor, will be scheduled for 1 hour or 1.25 hours and will include instruction in sound research methods, a review of library materials specific to the course and online work using the library catalogue, fulltext or other databases and the web. We can accommodate up to 12 students at a time.

ALL BOOKINGS WILL BE CENTRALIZED

There are now two ways to book. You may either e-mail our Library Booker or contact her by telephone. We will not be taking any bookings at the library information desks.

If it is a Class Session, a librarian will contact you to discuss the type of session you require for your students, any special assignments and other arrangements for the class.
 - The name of the course or program.
 - The number of students
 - The preferable timeframe in which we can provide instruction to your group.

 Leave a detailed message at local 8348 for the Library Booker. Your call will be returned within 24 hours.

BOOK AHEAD OF TIME

Booking early improves your chances of getting a class session or tour when you want it. Forward your request to the Library Booker at least two weeks in advance of your booking date, whenever possible.

The VCC Library video collection is heavily used by the VCC community but especially by you, the faculty. We would like to continue providing you with an excellent media booking service to support your curriculum needs. To

do this we need your help Please note the following changes to our services.

Effective immediately all video bookings and media enquiries will be handled through the Information Desk at your campus Library. Video bookings may be made in person, by completing a web booking form on the Library web site at www.vcc.ca/library (available in September!) or by phone (KEC - local 7326; CC local 8339).


Tip-top Shape

Despite the increasing use of Computer on Wheels (COW) in the classroom, the Overhead Projector (OHP) continues to be a very important instructional aid. Simple operation, low-tech requirements, low cost, and reliability (they don't crash!) make the Overhead Projector a tool difficult to surpass. Its presence in the classroom is likely permanent.

The typical Overhead Projector has a top piece of glass (stage glass) and just below that is a plastic lens with concentric circular lines on it (Fresnel lens). This lens is a very expensive part of your projector. Two other important components are the lamp and the fan.

Because of the simplicity of its design, the most common failures of overhead projectors are due to excessive heat. A fan running slow or a dirty motor will not cool a lamp sufficiently, shortening its life, or will cause warping of the Fresnel lens. You should never allow anything to block the airflow of your projector's cooling fan The intake and output vents must not be obstructed, or overheating will occur.

Please avoid moving the machine while the lamp is on, or even shortly after turning it off. This can cause premature lamp failure. A hot lamp filament can fall apart due to the machine being jarred.



Important reminders:

- * When not in use for an extended period, turn the unit off and DO NOT cover the stage glass with books.
- * DO NOT leave Overhead Projectors close to windows, because if exposed to the sun the Fresnel lens will melt.
- * The stage glass can be cleaned with glass cleaner. NEVER use glass cleaner on the Fresnel lens; it will destroy the plastic lens.

If you have concerns about noisy fans, lamp failure or a dirty Fresnel lens, call me and I will schedule proper cleaning and lubrication of your Overhead Projector or supply an alternate unit for your immediate use.
