1) AUDIO-VISUAL WORKSHOPS

It is part of an instructor's professional responsibility, (and I hope part of his training), to be able to competently operate the audio-visual equipment that he uses. Alas, we do not have the support staff to operate A-V equipment in the classrooms, and, with the state of the budget being what it is, there is no way by which we are likely to get extra staff in the foreseeable future.

Recently, Parveen brought me mangled pieces of film, the result of an instructor's sheer incompetence. We may soon be in the position of having to say, "If you can't operate the equipment, you can't use it". A few instructors have been rude to our very harrassed audio-visual staff to cover their own inadequacies.

However, help is at hand. George Morgan, Assistant Director of Audio-Visual Services, VCC, is planning to give a series of workshops to help you. Since we plan for "hands on" time we would like to limit each session to a maximum of twenty people, repeating sessions where called for. We also plan to videotape each session as a start towards mediated learning units on the subject of audio-visual equipment. One and a half hours will be allowed for each session with provision for a half-hour carry-over if necessary.

Dear Mr. Monasch

I have received a number of very eloquent letters from students in programmes at the King Edward Campus which have been threatened with cuts because of the budget cutback.

I feel certain that your instructors have been placing before their students the sorrowful details of our budget position and I am sure that the instructors themselves are aware that as far as is known by the Administration and Council of this College, allocations of vocational and academic-technical funds cannot be intermingled. I wrote to the Minister of Education, under date of October 2, 1975 (copy of letter is enclosed) asking for a specific answer to this question.

In the interval I hope you will again assure your instructors that the budget cuts were all taken with an understanding of the total needs of this College and its students. I know that you and those persons involved in the decisions made at King Edward Campus did everything possible to adjust your allocation to cover as many programmes as was possible. It is my sincere hope that the budget for 1976/1977 will enable us to regain some of the ground lost this year.

Would you please request your instructors to thank their students for the initiative which they have displayed in writing to me regarding this problem: I will attempt to respond individually to each student.

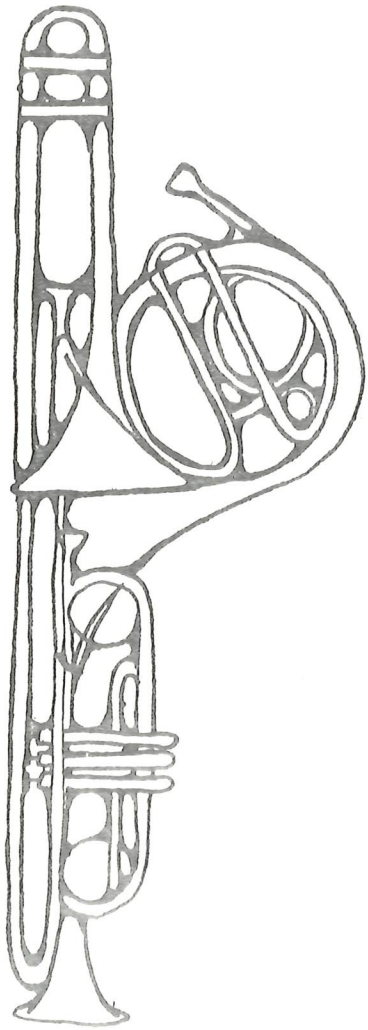
