Effective July 1, 1976 the Medical Services Plan (basic medical coverage) rates will increase as follows:

	<u>From</u>	<u>To</u>
Employees without dependents	\$ 5.00	\$ 7.50
Employees with one dependent	10.00	15.00
Employees with two or more dependents	12.50	18.75

The employee's share will increase as follows:

1. VMREU employees (permanent) - College contributes 50% of premium

	<u>From</u>	<u>To</u>
Employees without dependents	\$ 2.50	\$ 3.75
Employees with one dependent	5.00	7.50
Employees with two or more dependents	6.25	9.37

2. Instructors and Administrators - College contributes 60% of premium

All new increases will be deducted from the June Payrolls as medical coverage is prepaid.
