Persons having credits under the Teachers' Pensions Act and who recently transferred to the College Pension Act retain the same rights regarding purchase of war service and out of province teaching service as if they had remained under the Teachers' Pensions Act throughout their combined service.

In other words, the transfer does not give such persons additional privileges, nor does it deny them privileges which they would have been able to exercise if the transfer had not taken place.

As you know, the purchase of war service and out of province teaching service privileges cannot be exercised until a few months before the teacher's actual date of retirement.
