3) SALARY INDEMNITY PLAN (Received from D.D. Jones, Director of Personnel)

Effective July 1, 1976, through the efforts of a joint committee dealing with employee benefits, a Salary Indemnity Plan for all faculty, administrators, and support staff covered by the group insurance plan was implemented providing the following benefit.

July 1, 1976	\$133.00 per week, maximum 26 weeks.
January 1, 1977	\$133.00 per week, maximum 52 weeks.

This benefit commences upon expiration of sick leave or 15 working days, whichever last occurs, and the premium cost of this benefit is borne by the group insurance reserve fund at no additional cost to the employee or the employer.
