3) ADDITIONAL SERVICE

The Learning Centre is now offering tutoring services to English Language Training students between the hours of 1030 and 1300 and also 1730 and 1900 daily. As such, the Learning Centre now serves all areas of the campus in a variety of ways. Students from all divisions can receive extra assistance in the form of tutoring, audio-assisted mini-courses and computerized instruction. Subjects on audio tape include a basic spelling series, essential composition and writing skills development, basic reading skills, word study for comprehension and a variety of math tapes on metrics, fractions and basic algebra.

Within a week, the audio carrels should be connected and the Centre will have ten individual listening posts for student access.

of the location and the availability of the Learning Centre.

4) SCHOOL CERTIFICATES

Effective with the opening of school on Tuesday, September 7, 1976, students in possession of a school certificate and entitled to travel at student fares must show the certificate at all times after 1800 hours on school days, and at all times on Saturdays, Sundays and Statutory Holidays.

On all regular school days up to 1800 hours, students must be in possession of a school certificate to travel on student fares but need only display same on request of a transit operator or transit supervisor.

This change in procedure has been introduced in the best interest of operator-student relationships.

Certificates issued for the last school term can be used until September 15. The new (1977) certificates are green and are valid as soon as issued.

SUMMARY OF DUTIES:

The Dean of Instruction is responsible to the Principal, Vancouver Vocational Institute and has the delegated responsibility for the planning, development, implementation, staffing, supervision, and evaluation of the Technical Division, Service Division and Business and Health Division at the Vancouver Vocational Institute and its satellite centres. Acts in a liaison capacity with the Dean of Administration particularly with respect to financial responsibilities.

EXAMPLES OF SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

 Responsible for the planning of new programs and the modification of current programs in order to meet the changing needs of the community.

- Interview potential instructors, recommends the filling of instructional positions to the Principal, evaluates (in writing) instructors, and provides support and encouragement for them.

- Prepares, instructional timetables, and in consultation with the chairman, schedules

instructors.
 Prepares, in co-operation with other administrators and the Executive Assistant for Information Services, the annual calendar and most other brochures and advertising materials.

- Acts as a liaison with administrators and divisional chairmen at the other centres of Vancouver Community College and elsewhere in respect to the ways in which the programs of the Vancouver Vocational Institute relate to their institutions.

- Works closely with student services personnel in order to adjust instruction to students' needs.

- Maintain a constant liaison with the Community Education Services Centre.

- Responsible for evaluating faculty as assigned by the Principal.

ADDITIONAL DUTIES:

Performs other duties as assigned by the College Principal or the Vancouver Vocational Institute, Principal.

QUALIFICATIONS:

A minimum of five years experience as an instructor and/or administrator at a community college or similar institution, having at the same time an understanding and sympathy for its philosophy and goals. Academic qualifications to the Bachelor's degree level (or equivalent). An ability to work well with instructors and students. The ability to delegate authority through division and department chairmen is essential.
