Vancouver Community College, through C.E.S. is offering a two day working seminar designed especially to give assistance to those instructors actively involved in teaching adults, on February 4 and 5.

The seminar will give a concise introduction to those new to teaching adults, and be a welcome refresher to those who have been so involved for a long time.
