


6) SUMMER LANGUAGE BURSARY PROGRAM, 1977

During the coming summer, this program will assist over 7,000 Canadian students to take immersion courses in French or English at their choice of forty-three accredited institutions across the country. The bursary program, which has been expanding steadily since its inauguration in 1972, is funded by the Department of the Secretary of State and administered by provincial departments responsible for post-secondary education.

Students are eligible if they meet the following conditions:

- (a) are Canadian Citizens or landed immigrants at the time of application.
- (b) have attained post-secondary standing (completion of Grade 12) by June 30, 1977.
- (c) were enrolled in full-time studies during the academic year of 1976-77.
- (d) were at least 16 years old by December 31, 1976.

The bursary is valued at \$800.00 and covers such costs as tuition, accommodation, meals, and instructional materials. The bursary is paid directly to the institution at which the student has been accepted.




The Union has made application to consolidate the two certificates.


