  A Bookstore Control Form will be completed when books are issued. If for any reason you are unable to pick up your supply of books during the above hours, please contact the cashier by phone and have the books set aside for pick up when convenient.

The above procedure must be followed to enable us to control the sale of books.


#### 13) LIFE MEMBERSHIP
