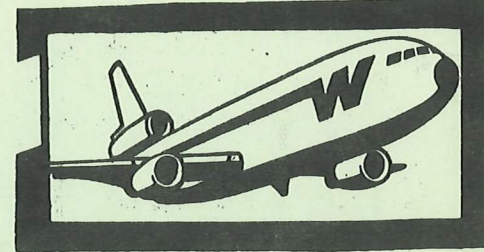
2) A FOND FAREWELL

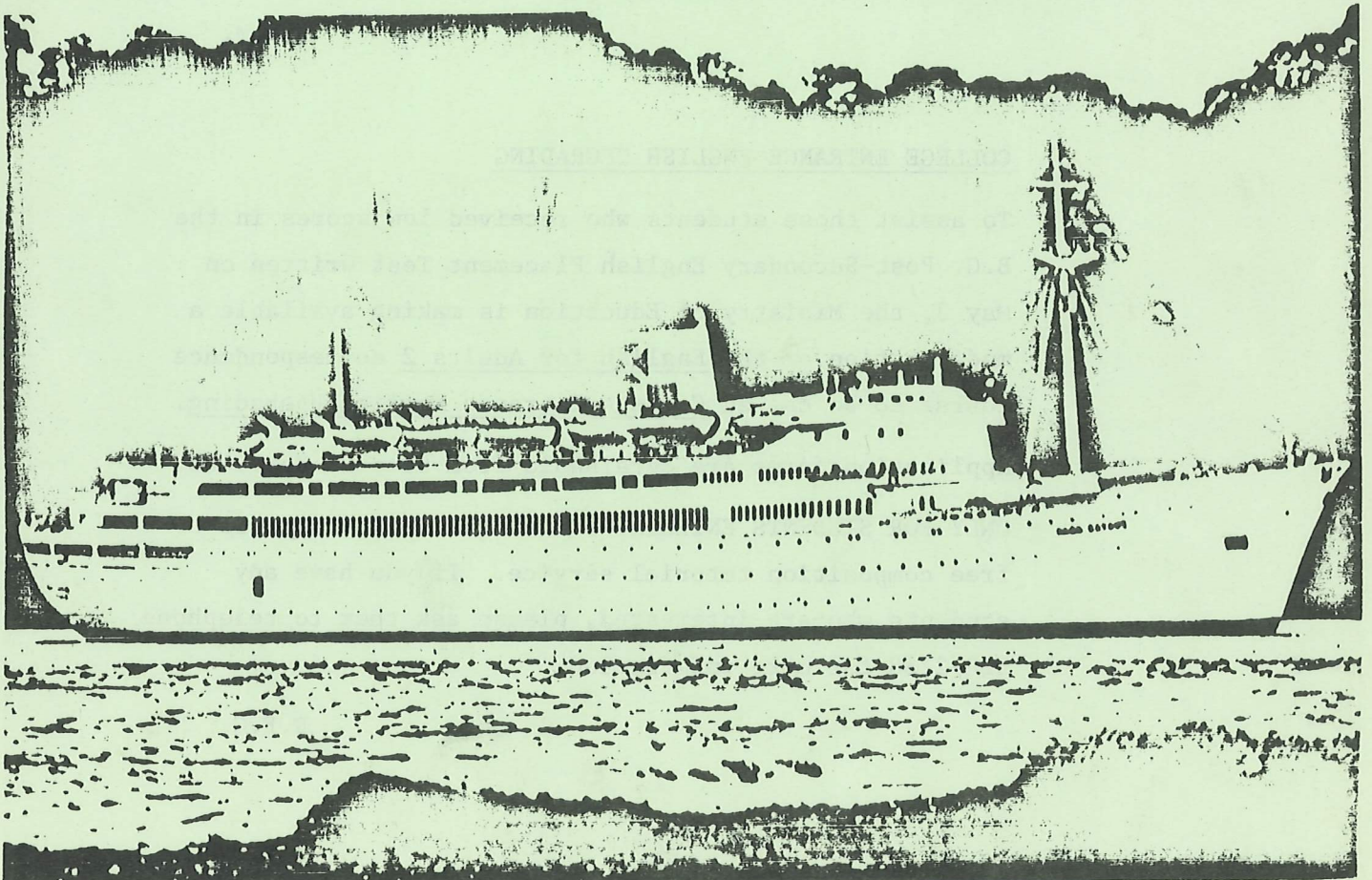

Would you like a chance to meet people from Japan - to get to know something about them and their country, and to share with them something about your country?

As part of the program to learn about Canada and practise speaking English, Japanese high school and university students will be coming to Vancouver in July and August for a two to three week combined program of special English classes at Langara campus of Vancouver Community College and a stay in local homes. The students will spend the mornings studying English and the afternoons touring Vancouver, while the evenings are kept open to spend some time with their host families.

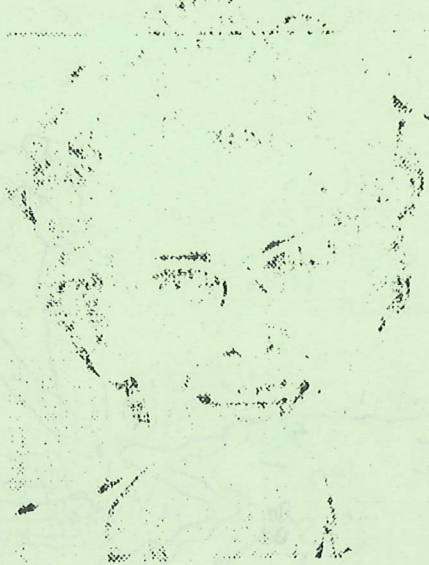
