# 9) LAST CHANCE!

C. for the King Edward Library as a remembrance of Louis Monasch's many years of service to the College). If you have not contributed to the fund - and would like to - please see Rita Shelley or me.

10) BRAHM WIESMAN REPORT ON "FACILITY PLANNING AND PROGRAM RATIONALIZATION, POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION IN THE LOWER MAINLAND".

Six copies of the above-named Report will be placed in the Library late today (Friday) or by Monday morning.

The Report makes recommendations respecting needed additional college/vocational facilities in the lower mainland and, although Mr. Wiesman's recommendations are fairly specific respecting some regions included in the Study, the references to King Edward's space problems, while recognized and addressed, do not result in concrete recommendations.

The Report, as indicated above, does address itself to our space needs. The following extracts from the Report reflect Mr. Wiesman's concern:

pp. 11 and 12:

"In the event King Edward College (sic) is not otherwise permanently accommodated through current negotiations, join with V.V.I. and instead of proceeding with tower in 9, above, construct 250,000 sq. ft. of permanent space on East Broadway corridor and include space for V.C.C. offices now rented, and for building construction program now in leased space. Additional cost over item 9, including site and remodelling of V.V.I.".

Reference on p. 16 is very similar to the above:

"In the event that a permanent solution to the space requirements of King Edward College (sic) is not found in negotiations currently in progress, then I would recommend that no expansion take place at the V.V.I. site (except for taking over Vancouver Art School space if and when it becomes available) and that a new College be constructed in Vancouver on the East Broadway corridor. This should involve realigning the functions of the two campuses, and moving some of the V.V.I. shops to East Broadway, including the construction program now located in leased Raymur St. space".

p. 17: "My best judgement is that a new campus in the order of 250,000 sq. ft. is sufficient to accommodate the needs of both institutions, including V.C.C. offices and the relocation of the Raymur Street Building Construction program. The division of functions between the two campuses should proceed from first principles without regard to the present arrangement. Some of the English language and basic education programs should be decentralized into Vancouver School Board space".

The above are three extracts from the Report. The Report itself is not lengthy. If you have time, do read it in its entirety.

Mr. Wiesman has recognized our needs; I am hopeful - even optimistic - that officials in the Ministry - and the Minister himself - will move quickly to resolve our space problems.
