K.E.C. is pleased to announce a Canadian sporting victory, in which a member of the College, Tom Peterson, an E.L.T. instructor, participated. Tom reported that the Canadian National Team of Team Handball beat Mexico 26 to 20 and went on to the next qualifying round to compete in a two-game series against the U.S.A. The first of these two games was held in Edmonton and the Canadian team won 26 to 14. The second game was staged in Minneapolis where the States managed to defeat Canada - 18 to 16. But on game score average, the Canadian National Team was the victor, and have therefore qualified for the World Championships, in which 16 teams will participate, to be held in Copenhagen, Denmark, January 1978.
