1) KEC SURVEY

First of all, to those who assisted in conducting the survey - many thanks. Over 1700 students responded.

The data, upon analysis, yields a great deal of interesting information. In many instances, the answers to one question were cross-tabulated with those to another question. I have the computer print-out in my office. Please feel free to drop in and study it.

I will try to give you a summary of some of the highlights:

- 1. Responses: 1704
- 2. Full/Part-time split:

Full-time - 45% Part-time - 55%

- 3. Approx. 83% of our students live in Vancouver, 6% in Burnaby, 5% in North and West Vancouver and 3% in Richmond. However, students come from as far away as Southeast Surrey, Coquitlam and Port Coquitlam.
- 4. 38% of all respondents plan to take more than one program at KEC. Approx. 17% are taking work in two or more programs simultaneously.
- 5. Work: 43% of our students work. 5.3% work 1-10 hrs. per week; 5.6% work 10-20 hrs; 22.8% work 20-40 hrs. and 9.1% work 40+ hrs.
- 6. 11% of our students are over 40 years of age.
- 7. Morning has the heaviest concentration of students at KEC.
- 8. 35% of our students drive to work. 42% of those driving are C.F. and 38% are ELT; 13% are BTSD. 41% travel by bus and transfer. Most take about ½ hr. to get to KEC. 2.5% take less than 15 minutes. 10.6% take 45 min. or more.

9. Plans after KEC:

565 or 34.6% of students plan to work

218 or 13.3% of students plan to go to Langara

189 or 11.6% of students plan to go to BCIT

168 or 10.3% of students plan to go to University

229 or 14.0% of students plan to go to WI

266 or 16.3% of students have other unspecified plans.

Of those going to work; 19.7% are CF, 15.1% are BTSD, 52.1% are ELT.

19.7% of all CF go to work; 35.5% of all BTSD go to work; 42.8% of all ELT go to work. Of those going to Langara after KEC, 67.5% are from CF; 8% from BTSD; 6.4% from ELT.

Of those going to VVI after KEC, 8% are from CF; 27.3% from BTSD; 44% from ELT.

40% of music students go to University, 30% go to work; 5.6% go to Langara and 24.4% have other plans.

10. Use of facilities and services:

Language Lab: 23.7% (50% of ELT students use Lang. Lab)

Learning Centre: 37.5%; largest % age users of Learning

Centre are CF - 40.3 of total; BTSD - 16.1%; ELT - 37.1%.

Library: 57.9%; largest % age users of Library

are ELT - 44.7%; CF - 31.1%; BTSD - 14.2%.

Counselling: 18.7% (almost 50% of those using Counselling

are CF).

Health: 7.3% (25% using Health Service are BTSD;

19.5% are CF; 35% are ELT.


Reading Lab: 6.6%; used most by ELT - 57.8%; CF - 17.4%;

BTSD - 16.5%.

Typing Room: 5.3%; used primarily by ELT - 30.7%;

CF - 37.5% and Pharmacy - 19.3%.

7) COLLEGE COUNCIL MEETING: WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 26, 1977

In public session last Wednesday, the College Council discussed at length and approved the proposed 1978-79 operating budget of the College.

Preliminary budget drafts had been prepared by the several budget centres (of which King Edward Campus is one). These drafts were given careful review and amended by the College Administrative Board, assembled into a single package by the Bursar and his staff, and then given final approval by C.A.B. for presentation to the College Council.

On Wednesday, Council - meeting in committee of the whole - discussed each budget centre's proposed lefts in detail. Spokesmen for the centres were on hand to answer the questions raised by Council members. Several motions carried, one of which addresses itself to the budget and therefore is of major interest to K.E.C., the first part of which reads as follows:

"That Vancouver Community College Council approve the proposed operating budget for 1978-79, with corrections as noted in committee of the whole..."

A great deal of work went into the preparation of our portion of the budget, involving a large number of people at this Campus. My personal thanks to all those who were involved. Special thanks to Nic Morelli and Doug Brown, who helped me "defend" our budget on Wednesday.

I have placed several copies of the budget in the Library for your perusal.
