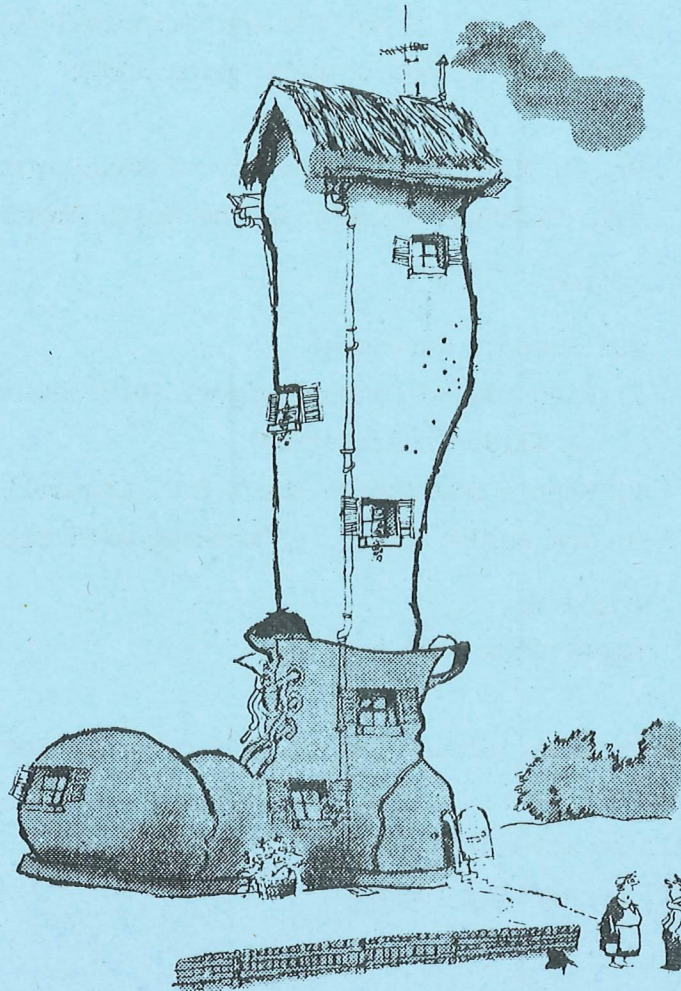

On November 18th, Dr. John Milsum, professor and director of the Division of Health Systems at U.B.C., will be presenting the Health Hazard Appraisal.

H.H.A. is a computerized analysis of your lifestyle in relation to health risks you take and profitable health habits you have, and makes prescriptions for ways you can reduce your health risks and live a healthier lifestyle. This analysis is similar to the one given at the Y.M.C.A. downtown Vancouver; but you have the opportunity of having a personal H.H.A. done for you by Dr. Milsum for a fee of only \$1.00!

PHARMACIST OF THE YEAR

Society honors Ben Gant

Ben Gant, Vancouver pharmacist presently operating Gant's United Pharmacy on the corner of Kingsway & Earles Road, Vancouver, has been chosen "Pharmacist of the Year" by B.C. Pharmacists' Society.

This is the first time in the history of the profession of pharmacy in B.C. that such recognition has been given.

Mr. Gant has an impressive list of contributions and activities that led to him being chosen for the honor.

FIVE YEARS

He served on the B.C. Pharmaceutical Council for five years, introducing and putting into practice the concept of Professional Fee for Service.

He served on the Canadian Pharmaceutical Association Council and acted as secretary for the B.C. delegation while doing so. He also took a very active part in the special committee on the fee for service concept and contributed to the acceptance of it on the national level.

He was the first pharmacist west of

Winnipeg to adopt and put into practice the Drug Record Profile System, which he introduced to the B.C. Association and initiated its acceptance.

Mr. Gant has contributed a great deal of his time teaching and expounding at UBC and continuing education seminars.

UPDATES INDEX

He is the author and publisher of the Drug Interaction Index, which he updates with supplements twice a year.

He has spoken at various continuing education sessions and seminars and to many social service and community organizations.

He wrote the first curriculum and instigated the first Pharmacy Association program in B.C., and he is still serving his profession as a professional clinical instructor in pharmacy.

Throughout all his career as a pharmacist, he has by word and action endeavored to promote the professional function and need of the community pharmacist.
