9) COLLEGE COUNCIL MEETING, WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 9, 1977

At its regular meeting, in public session, our College Council on Wednesday last dealt with a rather lengthy agenda; several items, I believe, are of particular interest to us at this Campus.

- a) In committee-of-the-whole, the members discussed the College Administrative Board's proposal respecting "designation, by-laws, etc.," for the College. (The proposal had been requested by Council a month ago.)

Because Council Chairman, J. M. Kennedy will be attending the inaugural meeting of the Management Advisory Committee (established under the Act) on November 10th, exhaustive discussion was deferred pending more information being made available to the members.

However, Council did adopt the following motion:

"That a 'Designation Committee' of Council be struck to:

- i) consult, advise and direct respecting the further development of by-laws;
- ii) establish liaison with College Council and School Boards respecting designation, by-law development and the delimitation of the Vancouver Community College region;
- iii) report respecting the state of the designation process and recommend thereupon at a meeting of College Council not later than December 14, 1977."

(The 'Designation Committee' members are Councillors J. Baker, W. Brown and J. M. Kennedy.)

- b) Council discussed, with representatives from the Langara Faculty Association, the Association's brief entitled "Separate Designation for Langara: A Statement of Philosophy." After lengthy discussion, Council simply received the Brief. Additionally, Council advised the Designation Committee that it favours the designation of Vancouver Community College as a single college comprising its present centres/campuses.
- c) Dr. Denholm reported to Council that a new draft lease has been prepared respecting an additional facility for King Edward Campus (on West 8th Avenue). College Council may have to meet on this matter again in special session.
- d) Council received financial reports for the period ending September 30, 1977.

The agenda and supporting papers respecting the above (and other) matters were made available at the meeting. I have placed two copies of the material in our Library.

The V.C.C. Music Department presents 'The Christmas Dance' and invites all College faculty, staff, and friends.

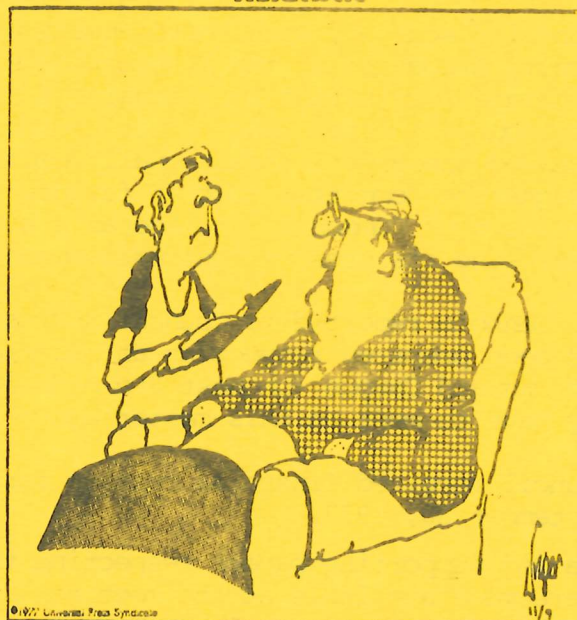
