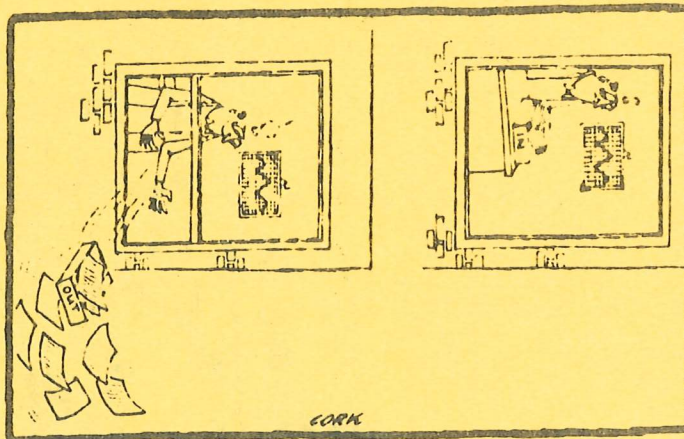

5. Please place only one item at a time in the microwave.

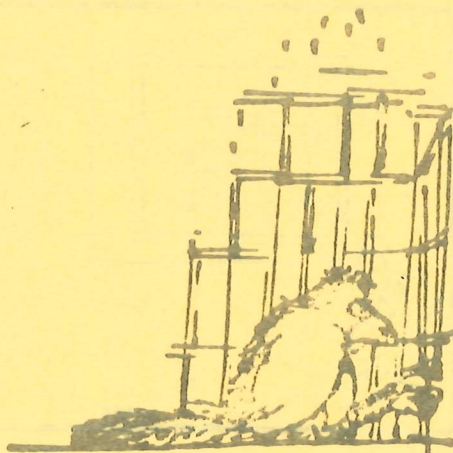
Note: We will be adding one more microwave as soon as another electrical hook-up is installed.


Volume

(effective April 1, 1978)

Duties:

The Department Head, Counselling, King Edward Campus, has the delegated responsibility for the day-to-day operation of Counselling Services.

Examples of Specific Responsibilities:

- 1) To be responsible for and supervise the activities of counsellors in the day-to-day operation of the counselling centre in providing testing, educational, vocational, personal and informational counselling services to students and faculty.
- 2) To supervise counsellors (regular and substitute) regarding course planning, assessment, and setting up appropriate programs for students.
- 3) To set criteria for the assessment of educational standards relating to prospective students.
- 4) To draw up the counsellors' work and vacation schedules.
- 5) To assist and encourage counsellors in their professional development.
- 6) To serve in a liaison capacity with community agencies as required.

Additional Duties:

To carry out such other duties as assigned from time to time by the Principal and/or the Dean of Administrative and Student Services.

Desirable Qualifications:

Desirable qualifications include a master's degree in Counselling Psychology or equivalent; administrative experience and appropriate background in vocational and career counselling, with experience in community education programs. A good knowledge of community services and the public school system is essential.

Salary: Salary and annual allowance are in accordance with 1977/78 agreement.
