After the above dates, regular times for photos will be resumed as posted in A/V Department.

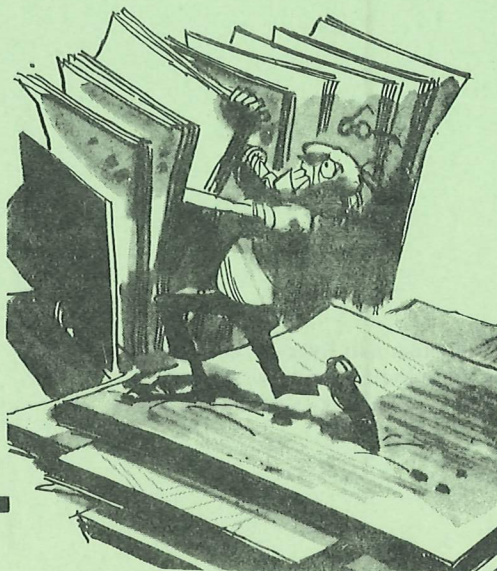

5) METRIC MEANDERINGS



Most people would use their car to cover distances in kilometres and their feet to cover distances in metres.

km
(kilometre)

We use kilometres to measure longer distances. The distance from one city or town to another would be measured in kilometres. Car speeds are measured in kilometres per hour (km/h). For wind speeds km/h is used.

m
(metre)


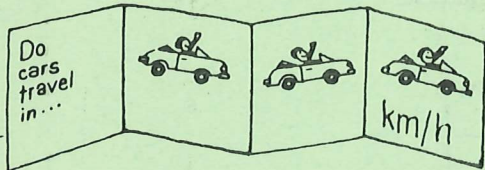
A metre is about an average man's long step. The average door opening is a little over 2 m high and a door handle is approximately 1 m from the floor. $1000\text{ m} = 1\text{ km}$

cm
(centimetre)

A convenient unit for shorter lengths is the centimetre. The widest part of your little fingernail is about 1 cm wide. Snowfall is measured in cm (centimetre) $100\text{ cm} = 1\text{ m}$

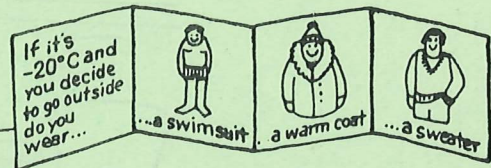
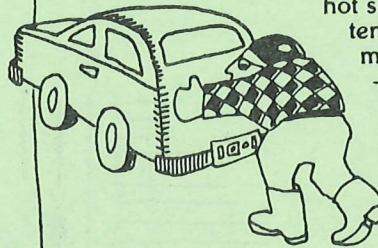
mm
(millimetre)

The thickness of a dime is about 1 mm and 10 mm or 1 cm is equal to a stack of 10 dimes.



Canada's weather temperature reports are being given in degrees Celsius only...

It's really very simple. On the Celsius scale, water freezes at 0°C ; 20°C is room temperature; and 30°C is a hot summer day. When the temperature is -10°C you might like to go skating; at -30°C you could have trouble starting your car.

A reminder to faculty to please inform the Principal's secretary (in writing) of changes in address or telephone.

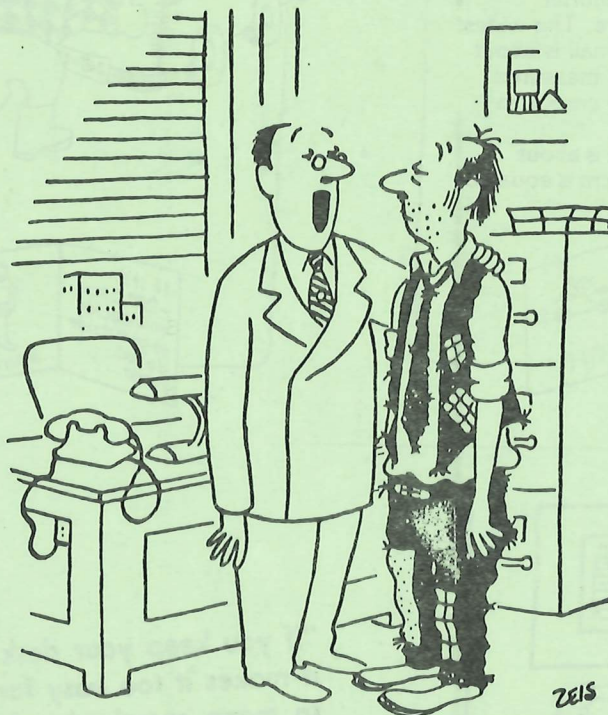
