1) COLLEGE COUNCIL MEETING

The inaugural meeting of the new Council was held on Wednesday. It was also the first meeting of Council attended by VCC Principal, A. S. Manera.

Five of six Council members served last year and have been reappointed for an additional one-year term (or until VCC is designated under the new (legislation). The five Council members appointed to date are:

William Brown and Betty-Anne Fenwick - appointed by the Vancouver School Board.

Jonathan Baker, James M. Kennedy and J. C. Melvin Scott - appointed by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council. (A fourth member is yet to be appointed by the government.

J.C. Melvin Scott was elected chairman; William Brown was elected vice-chairman.

Regular Council meetings will be held on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays at 7:00 p.m.

Liaison Council members were named for each of VCC's four major divisions:

Betty-Anne Fenwick to C.E.S.

Jonathan Baker to K.E.C.

J.C. Melvin Scott to Langara. (Mr. Scott indicated his intention to name the yet-to-be-appointed member in his stead when the appointment is made.)

William Brown to V.V.I.

In one other item of business, Council agreed not to establish standing committees but, rather, to move into committee-of-the-whole when expedient to do so.
