Signs are posted near the cashier's wicket in the Administration Office, in the Counselling area, and on the Student Council Bulletin Board.

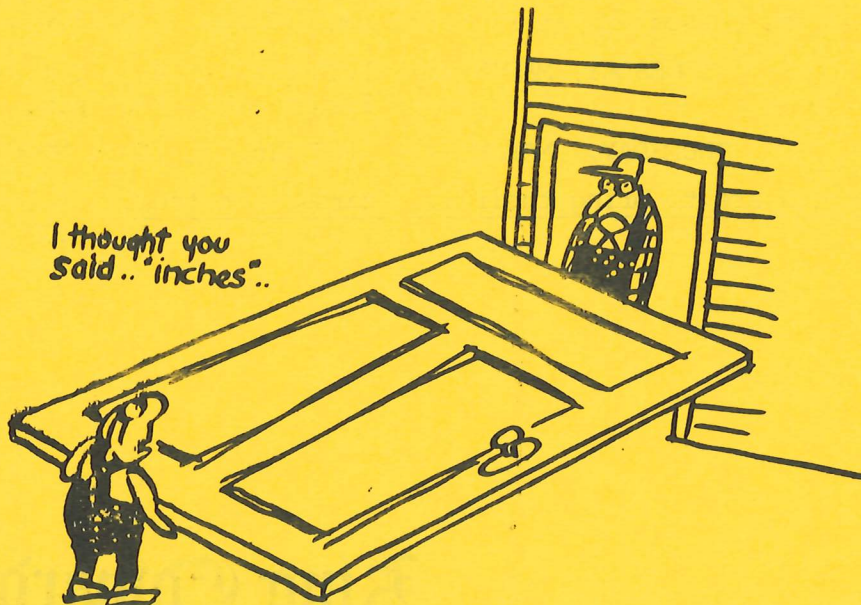

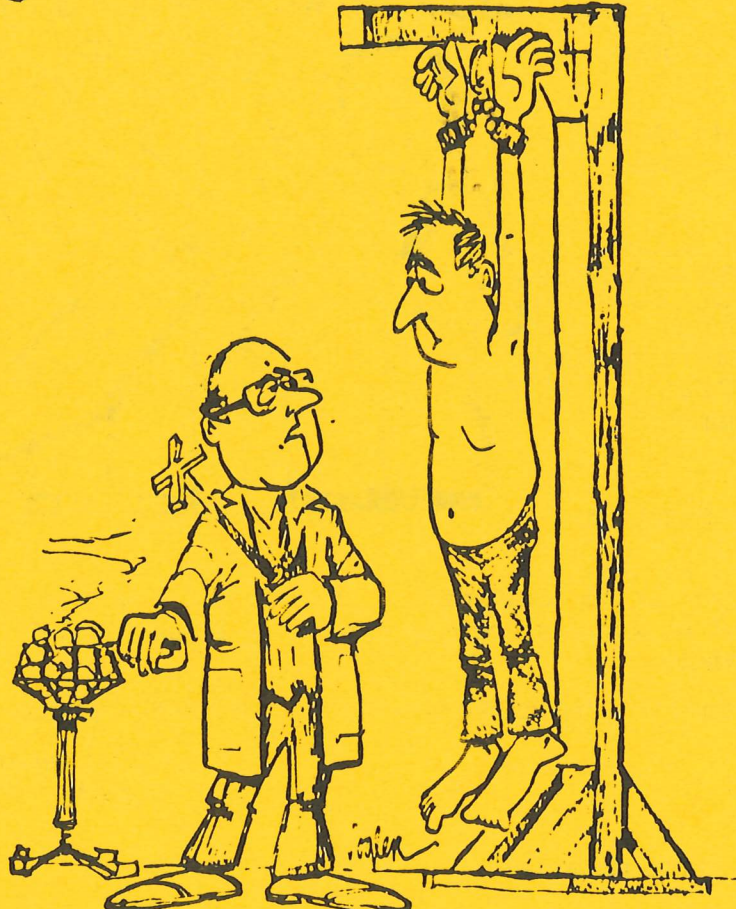

6) SUMMER EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS/YOUTH

The Ministry of Labour, Province of British Columbia will again this year provide funds for the employment of a limited number of youth by Vancouver Community College. The program seeks to create jobs for youth that will promote the development of skills which will contribute to their future position/employability in the labour force.

Each summer project may be designed to employ up to five persons. Jobs that will be considered for funding are those which will create two to five months of full-time employment for a student or an unemployed person 15 to 24 years of age. Detailed program regulations are attached to the applications for funding.

Applications for funding of projects may be obtained from Mrs. Rita Shelley in the administration office.

Project proposals should be submitted by March 23rd to Mrs. Shelley in order to allow sufficient time for their study and assessment by the adjudicating committee.
