8) INFORMATION FROM THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT

Some contraindications and precautions when taking aspirin, or giving aspirin to someone else:

1. Ask if the person is allergic to aspirin, or aspirin compounds (222/292). Aspirin should not be given to persons who have known allergic reaction.
2. Ask whether the person has a stomach ulcer; aspirin may cause a "peptic attack" or cause the ulcer to hemorrhage.
3. Aspirin should be administered cautiously to people with asthma and other allergic conditions, or to those who have a history of ulcerations of stomach or intestines, and anemia.
4. Persons taking 8 to 9 aspirin tablets per day are at an increased risk of developing severe gastro-intestinal bleeding following ingestion of alcohol.
5. If female, ask whether she is pregnant. Aspirin may interfere with maternal and infant blood clotting and may lengthen the duration of pregnancy. A pregnant woman should consult with her doctor before taking aspirin.
6. Ask if the person is taking any other medicines; do not give aspirin to persons on regular medical treatment, as aspirin may counteract, change or inhibit elimination of certain medicines.

Did You Know?

The C.P.S. (doctor's drug and medicine reference book) recommends that uncoated aspirin tablets should not be swallowed whole, but should be well chewed and followed with an adequate volume of water, or crushed into a fine powder and taken as a suspension in orange juice. If chewing or crushing is not possible, the tablets should be taken with a large volume of water so as to help dissolve the crystals and prevent the formation of a saturated solution in the stomach.

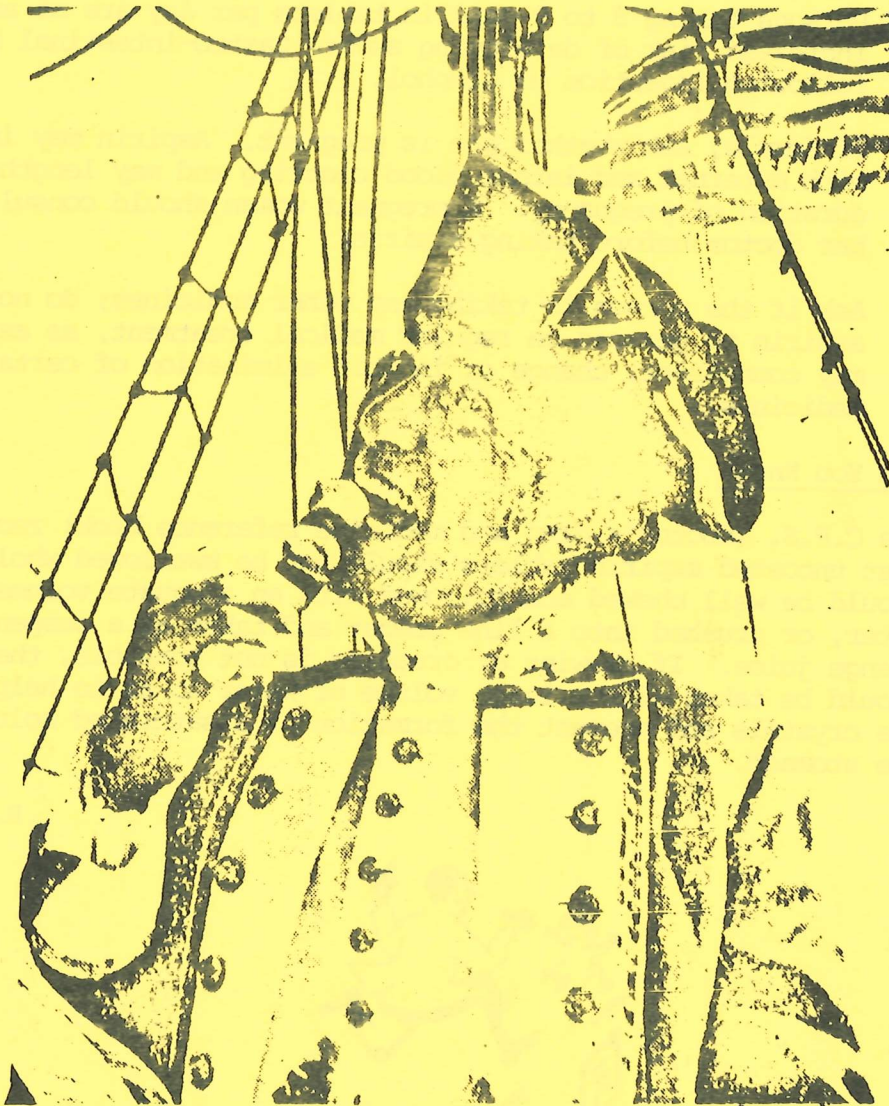


9) CAPTAIN COOK AND THE NOOTKA
