FOREST PRODUCTS TECHNOLOGY OPPORTUNITIES AT B.C.I.T.

The Ministry has been asked to call attention to the following announcement:

Despite the importance of the Forest Industry in British Columbia, and the availability of jobs for technicians in the industry, there are still vacancies in the Wood Products Option of the Forest Products Program and in the Pulp and Paper technology program at B.C.I.T.

All graduates of these programs are hired by the industry at the end of their two year program at B.C.I.T. Wood Products Option graduates qualify for such positions in sawmill and plywood plants as production and maintenance supervisors, maintenance planners, production control statisticians, quality control statisticians, kiln-drying specialists, mill design specialists, and research technicians. Pulp and Paper graduates have been hired in pulp and paper mills as environmental control technicians, process technologists, engineering assistants, research and development technologists. Both programs are open to men and women.

Superintendents of Schools, principals, and counsellors are urged to inform their students about job opportunities available through these technologies. B.C.I.T. has prepared an excellent slide and tape presentation on each of these programs. These, together with brochures and other promotional and informative material may be obtained for demonstrating what the programs are all about from Mr. Gordon Harris, Chief Instructor of the Forest Products Program, British Columbia Institute of Technology, 3700 Willingdon Avenue, Burnaby, B.C., V5G 3H2.

Applicants for these programs require graduation on the selected studies program or the combined studies program with Mathematics 12 or Algebra 12 required for both programs, Chemistry 11 for the Pulp and Paper Products option, and either Biology 11 or Chemistry 11 or Physics 11 for the Wood Products Option. MERCHANDISING PROGRAM (a full-time, five months certificate program)

The Merchandising Program provides practical training for students whose career goals require knowledge and skills in supervisory or technical sales work related to the field of marketing and product distribution.

The three main goals of the program are:

- To provide balanced, comprehensive training in product distribution and marketing.
- To prepare students for advancement in their chosen field of distribution.
- 3) To provide students with fundamental marketing skills to enable lateral and vertical mobility in the job market.

The Merchandising Program is divided into two levels. The first level is of two months duration. The second level is of three months duration. The program is designed to cover those areas of marketing and sales listed below to provide the student with skills and a comprehensive knowledge of the field out of which creative decisions can be taken for particular sales situations.

The Merchandising Program is of five months duration and offers theoretical and practical training in the following general areas:

a) Introduction to Marketing

b) Economics of Business

c) Communications

) Psychology of Salesmanship

e) Marketing Fundamentals

f) Fundamentals of Business Management

g) Advertising and Sales Promotion

Related theory course content is taught in a classroom and practical training is provided in cooperation with businesses in the Vancouver area. (This major cooperative externship with business is intended as an integral component of the program).

EDUCATION: Grade Twelve or equivalent.

Division Chairmen are directly responsible for the representation of their divisions to the Dean of Instruction or delegate, and thence to the Principal. This is a faculty position covered by the current Collective Agreement between Vancouver Community College and the Vocational Instructors' Association. The position includes an instructional assignment.

DESIRABLE QUALIFICATIONS:

The initial appointment is for a one-year probationary period. Upon successful completion, the appointee shall be confirmed for an additional three-year period. An appointee may be re-appointed to additional three-year terms.

- Annual allowance above basic salary, \$2,725 per annum.

- Annual holiday of thirty days.
