Many times Horst is in the classroom building, or elsewhere on the campus because of a problem, but can always be reached by pager.

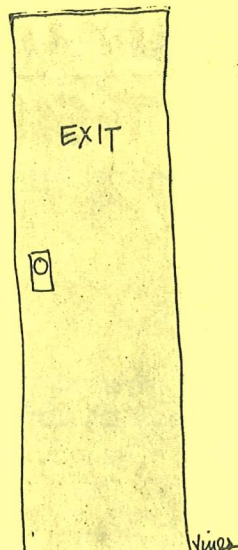
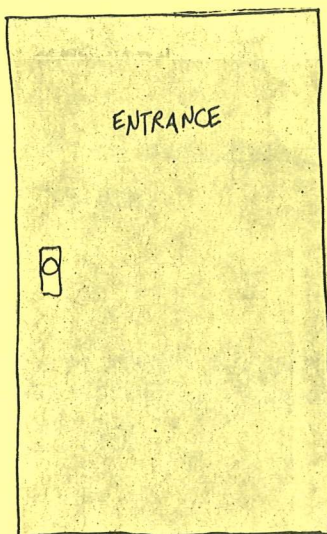
