4) SUCCESS STORY

For those of you who remember our blind student, Pat York:

Pat has just returned from the Canada Games for the Physically Handicapped held in Newfoundland from August 20 - 27.

Pat is still the Canadian wrestling champion, retaining the title he won last year (136½ lb. class, or 62 kilo for metrics). He also won two silver medals, one in the swimming 100 metre free-style, the other in the 100 metre breaststroke. Besides these, he won silvers in the 400 metre and 1500 metre track events.

Previously, in July, Pat won a bronze medal in the 10,000 metre, a silver in the 1500 metre, and a silver in wrestling - in the North American Games meet in Chicago.

Also, in August, he won a bronze in the 3000 metre Maritime Games.

What an inspiring list of achievements. Think of Pat next time you're discouraged!
