If there are any questions, ask the students to see Gary McLary, President of the Student Society.

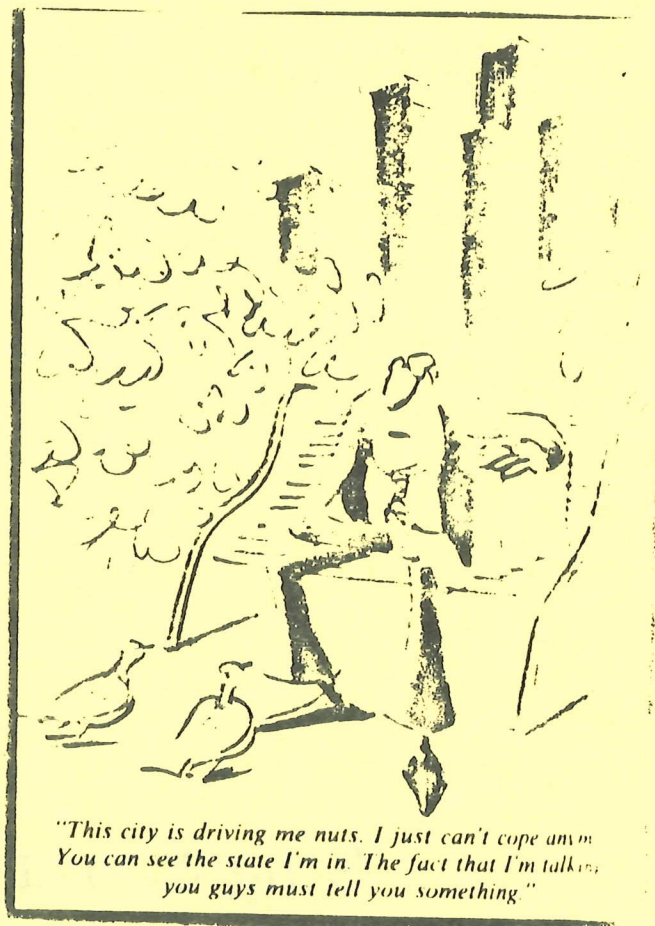

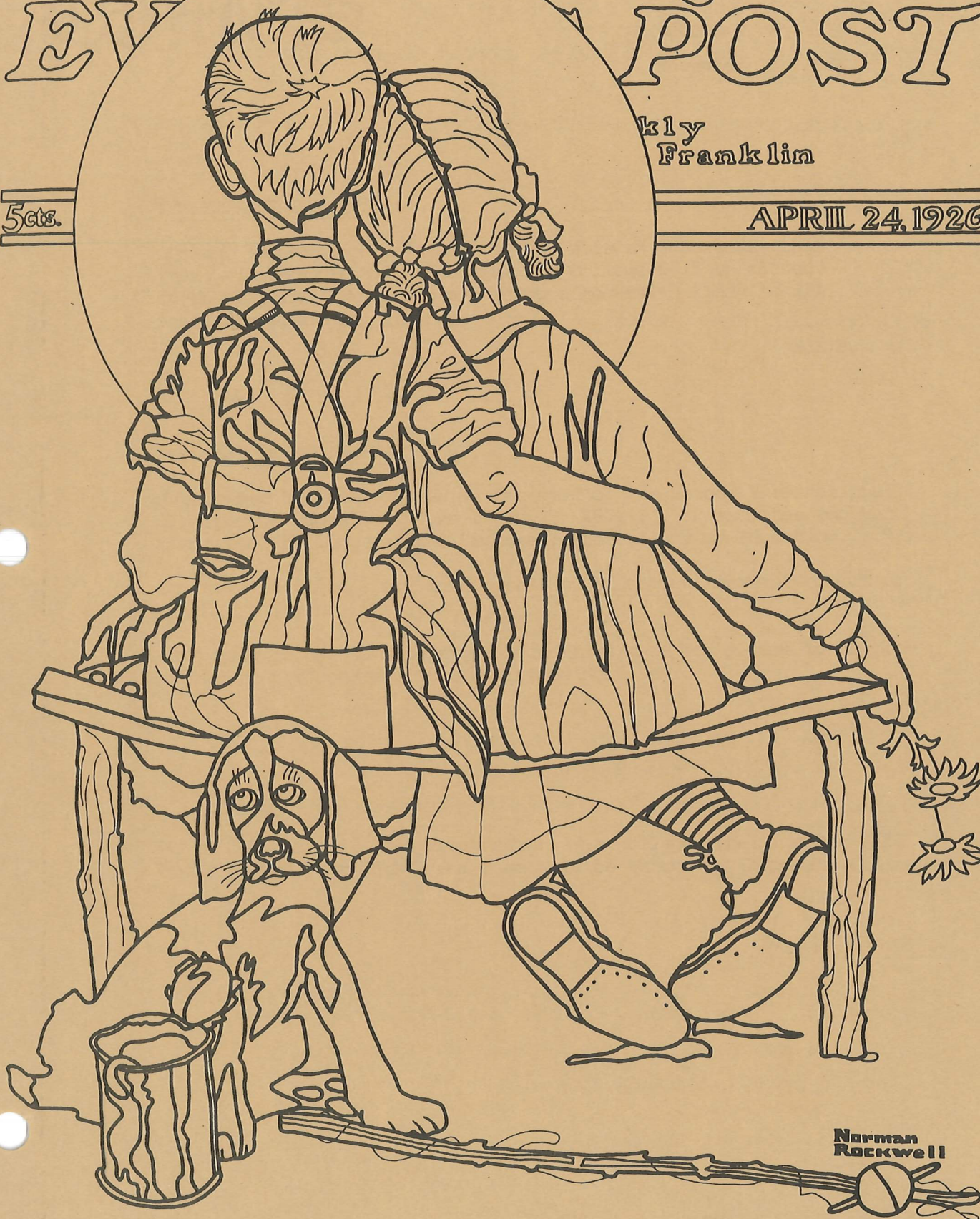

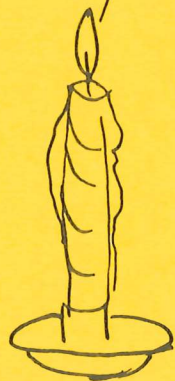
