

## 17) YOUTH EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM, May 1 - August 31, 1979

NOTE: This is a program separate from that referred to in Item 13 as "Youth Job Applications".

We have been advised by the Ministry of Labour that consideration will again be given for the funding of projects that will create summer employment for students.

The prime objective of the program is to "provide youth with opportunities to develop skills which will enhance their ability to gain future employment. Students should be encouraged to submit project proposals (with advice and assistance from faculty and staff, of course). Please advise your students of this opportunity.

Project application forms are available from Rita Shelley. The regulations are a part of the application form; initiators of project proposals should familiarize themselves with these regulations.

All project applications should be submitted to Rita Shelley no later than 12 o'clock noon on Wednesday, March 7th. An adjudication committee will review and assess the proposals on Friday, March 9th.
